Day of remembrance

Peacehaven will play its part as the nation remembers and honours the war dead.

Residents are invited to join the town council's guests for a ceremony at the war memorial in Meridian Park on Wednesday, November 11, at 10.45am.

The service will begin with a bugler sounding Last Post and Royal British Legion standards will be dipped.

As the notes fade away the town crier, Jon Borthwick, will read the Exhortation, the famous stanza from Laurence Binyon's poem For the Fallen that begins *They Shall Not Grow Old* . . .

Then a maroon will be launched to signal the two-minute silence and the town will join the rest of the country in marking the eleventh hour of the

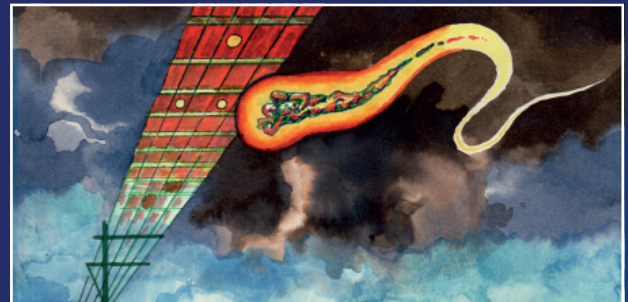
eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Another maroon will be launched and as the bugler sounds Reveille the RBL standards will be raised.

The Kohima Epitaph, *When You Go Home Tell Them Of Us* . . . , will be

read and the Rev Charlie Goring, vicar of Peacehaven and Telscombe Cliffs, will lead the company in prayer.

The guests, which will include pupils from town schools, will be invited to Community House for a drink and biscuit.

The next community consultation on Lewes District Council's proposals for new homes at Peacehaven, some to be built on existing car parks, will be held at the Meridian Centre on Monday, November 2, between 4.30pm and 7.30pm.

It will be a drop-in surgery for Peacehaven

and Telscombe residents. They will be able to see artists' impressions and discuss the proposals with district council officers and architects. The district council aims to build about 415 homes across the whole of the district.

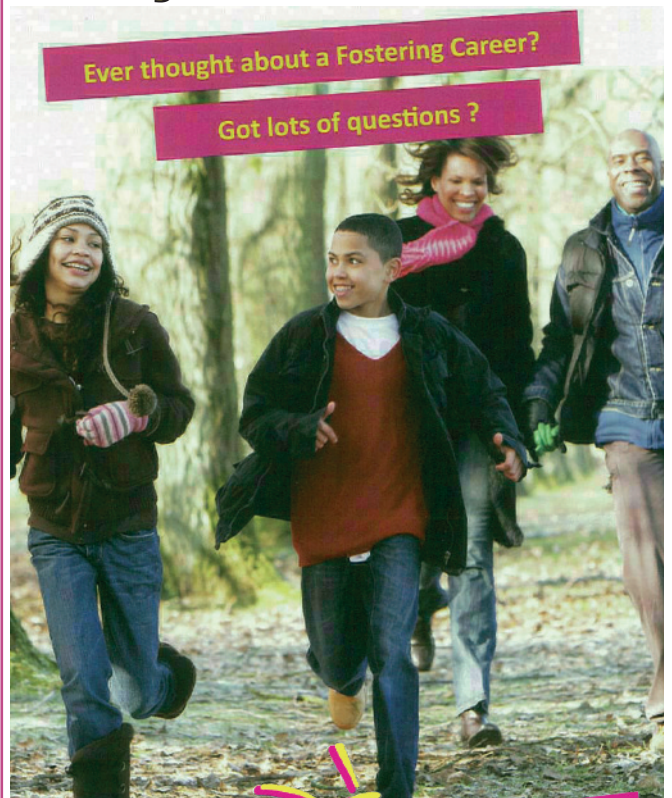
None of the homes planned for Peacehaven will be designated as "affordable housing".

Just too much mess

Dog owners are being asked to scoop the poop in Centenary Park.

The town council says there has been a major increase in the amount of dog mess not being picked up.

The Clean Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2005 allows councils to impose an instant fine of £80. In a magistrates court fines could be as much as £1,000.

There are adequate combination waste

bins in the park for waste disposal.

Dog owners should take a responsible attitude overall and keep their pets under control in the park at all times.

This may mean putting a dog on its lead near people and children's play areas.

The town council is also reminding all dog owners that excessive barking can annoy neighbours and asks them to curb noisy pets.

A by-election will be held in Peacehaven North Ward on Thursday, November 12, following the resignation of Mrs Pat Haswell from the town council.

Polling stations in the annexe room and the main hall at Meridian School will be open from 7am to 10pm.
