Peacehaven Heights School Swimming Club has welcomed nearly 80 families — adults and children of all abilities — for swimming lessons in its pool during the last year.

Costs are kept to a minimum because the school wants everyone to be able to afford the lessons.

School governor Angela Mills said: "We believe swimming shouldn't be about making lots of profit but helping everyone to be safe near the water.

"We want to be able to offer lessons to more families, open our doors to the elderly and disabled at specific

times and encourage more people in our community to become strong swimmers. Anyone can swim given the right support and we feel our lessons make a difference.

"Swimming is great exercise that is gentle on the body, so don't be afraid to give it a go. We want to work with you so don't let anything hold you back."
