The Peacehaven 100 celebrations are well under way. A highlight this month will be a staging of the history play Peacehaven On Special Offer at the Meridian Centre on Saturday, February 27, at 7pm.

The play about the town, first staged at The Dell in 2010, will be presented by The Company.

This specially commissioned piece with music from the 1930s and 1940s looks at the rather eccentric creation of the town since 1916 by following three different story lines — Charles Neville, the founder of Peacehaven, Felix Powell, the composer of the music for Pack Up Your Troubles In Your Old Kit Bag, and a pioneer family from Camberwell.

The part of Powell will be played by Ty Jeffries, the son of actor and film director Lionel Jeffries.

Tributes to chairman

The Mayor, Cllr Robert Robertson, on behalf of the town council, has joined in the tributes to Brian Suckling, chairman of Peacehaven & Telscombe FC, who has died after battling cancer.

"Sad news to hear about the loss of a lovely man," Cllr Roberston tweeted on social media.

Mr Suckling took over as chairman in December 2014 and the wealth of football knowledge he brought to the club in its hour of need will never be forgotten. His legacy will always be visible at the Sports Park as his drive was behind the campaign to raise funds for new stands and essential ground improvements.

Acting chairman Sue Norwood said: "He was popular with everyone at the club and we benefited immensely from his vast experience of football administration." Manager Simon

Colbran said: "Football has lost someone who has given more or less his whole life to the game. If it wasn't for him, this club would not be here."

As Member of Parliament for Brighton Kemptown and Peacehaven, I am often contacted by residents on the issue of Europe, among many others.

I am frequently asked when the referendum will take place. This is a decision for the Prime Minister but it will definitely happen by the end of 2017.

The Government has passed legislation guaranteeing an in-out referendum to be held on Britain's membership of the EU before the end of 2017 and the European Union

Referendum Act 2015 was passed in December.

There are strong views on both the Leave and Remain sides of the campaign. Personally I will be waiting

to see what the outcome of the PM's negotiations is before deciding.

However, in the end it is the British people who will decide whether we are stronger and better off with our European neighbours as part of the European Union or on our own. The Government has been absolutely clear in its position on EU membership – we should let the British people decide through an in-out referendum.
