# New rules curb verge parking

New regulations ban drivers from parking on some footpaths and grass verges in Peacehaven.

The restrictions ban stopping and waiting at any time in the following roads:

**Ambleside Avenue** — both sides for its entire length.

**Arundel Road** — both sides for its entire length.

**Roderick Avenue** — both sides from the junction with Sutton Avenue northwards to the junction with Glynn Road.

**Sutton Avenue** — both sides for its entire length.

# Slight rise in council tax

Council tax contributions for Peacehaven are to rise slightly from next month.

The town council has agreed the charge to taxpayers for the services it provides — included in the overall council tax bill — will go up only by the absolute minimum.

This means the tax rate for a band D house will rise by  $\pounds 1.37$  — less than 3p a week.

The council is proud its share of council tax has been frozen for the past five years but says the increase is necessary because its workload is increasing with more people moving to the town.

Improving services and retaining quality and value for money remain at the top of the agenda.
