Always remembered

Peacehaven will join the nation to remember and honour the war dead. Residents are invited to join the town council's guests for a ceremony at the war memorial in Meridian Park on Friday, November 11, at 10.45am.

The service will begin with bugler Melita Brett sounding Last Post.

As the notes fade away, the chairman of the Royal British Legion branch. Johan Janse van Vuuren, will read the Exhortation, the famous stanza from Laurence Binyon's poem For The Fallen that begins They Shall Not Grow Old. . .

Then a maroon will be launched to signal the two-minute silence and the town will join the rest of the country in marking the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Another maroon will be launched and the bugler will sound Reveille.

The Kohima Epitaph, When You Go Home Tell Them Of Us . . , will be read and the Rev Tim Mills, vicar of Peacehaven and Telscombe Cliffs, will lead the group in prayer.

Guests, including pupils from town schools, will be invited to Community House for refreshments.

The Royal British Legion will organise the Remembrance service on Sunday, November 13, mustering at the area opposite The Dell to march to the war memorial. Residents and guests will gather at Meridian Park ready for the 11am service. Guests will lay wreaths and the Legion has requested that medals and decorations should be worn.

Car park potholes will be filled

Two town councillors have been successful in getting improvements to car parks in Peacehaven and Telscombe Cliffs.

Cllr Jackie Harrison-Hicks said she and Cllr Dave Neave had met officers of Lewes District Council and she is thanking them for their help in getting action.

Piddinghoe Avenue car park has been partly resurfaced, Steyning

Avenue is to follow later this year and potholes in Fairlight Avenue are to be filled in.

She said: "Some broken fences around re-cycling bins have needed renewing and others will be replaced or repaired by the end of 2016."

She also said there would be extra visits by the re-cycling team to try to reduce the amount of fly-tipping at the car parks.



Speed patrol

Peacehaven's Community Speedwatch needs volunteers. Currently it has a team of eight but if more people do not come forward, the group may fold.

Community Speedwatch is about educating speeding drivers that breaking limits is not acceptable. Motorists going too fast are reported to police and they decide what action to take.

Christine Bowman, who chairs the group, said: "I have yet to encounter any hostility from the public, indeed many pedestrians welcome us! So I am asking. could you offer a couple of hours a week or recommend anyone who might be interested?"

The task of a Community Speedwatch operator is neither onerous nor dangerous. Training in health and safety, procedures and using the hand-held equipment will be given.
