"With reference to my letter of 16 February 2018 and the concern raised by Councillor Enever regarding the contractual commitment the Town Council has made to provide a local grass cutting service in 2018-19 in line with previous levels of funding, I can confirm the County Council will continue to fund this service to your parish for 2018-19 at the same level as previous years and as communicated to you in November 2017. You will therefore receive the same funding allocation for 2018-19 as previously provided. However, please note that the level of funding from 2019-20 onwards will be reduced in line with the County

# Weather Update

A band of cloud is heading our way later this evening and so the County Council will be gritting all primary routes from 9pm. This will be followed by gritting secondary routes and then primary routes again overnight, which will hopefully keep the network moving into the morning rush hour. County Council Duty officers will be available from 5pm today on 0345 60 80 193 to deal with any emergencies and they will be working closely with the emergency services if needed. Please take extra care on the roads, Peacehaven Council will provide further updates tomorrow.

# **ESCC Highways**

ESCC have not yet informed the Town Manager officially, however there is a meeting at ESCC on 22<sup>nd</sup> of February to discuss 'a number of works and improvements' within the town. The meeting will be with Lindsay Plumridge, Communication and Stakeholder Manager at ESCC, as well as Clerks for Telscombe and Newhaven, with the intention to discuss their plans. We do not yet know what those plans will be, however, please be assured if they discuss road improvements, we shall let you know as soon as able.

# **Churchill Development**

Lewes District Council Environmental teams have visited the site and spoken to the site manager regarding claims of littering. Having been fully investigated, this appeared to be the contents of a van emptied onto the grass verge where the contractors for cable laying for the Churchill site had been parked. They have been informed that this was unacceptable and that anyone working in or around the site had a duty of care for their waste and the consequences of this reoccurring would be the issue of a fixed penalty notice. The contractors have been spoken to and the site manager will be putting up laminated signage in the area of the cable laying. Lewes District Council will continue to monitor the site and take positive action should there be any further incidents. Hopefully this will improve the situation. The good news is that the cables being laid are due to be connected up to the site last week, so if they are all okay they should be filling in the trench and the fencing will be removed shortly. The site access route will continue to be monitored and all complaints should be referred to Building Control at Lewes District Council.

# Alan Sargent – West Ward (Chair of Residents Association)

The resident read the following:-

I refer to Agenda Item 6, Grass Verge Cutting and I'm pleased to hear funding from ESCC has been agreed for another year.

Under the Local Government Act, Parish and Town Councils are being encouraged to carry out local services such as grass cutting as more and more responsibility is being devolved down. Although devolving down should be planned and financially supported, this seems to be a quick fix to overcome a budget deficit however this has been resolved for 2018-19. Unfortunately this is the way of the future and Councils should start thinking out of the box to resolve the problem. I would suggest, impose a local bye law that households fronted with grass verges be responsible for the grass cutting and maintenance, other areas to be dealt with in house. Secondly do not allow grass verges with all new builds. When the opportunity arises use block paving in place of grass verges, these are easily replaced when services are required to be exposed, as used by most European countries. We recommend under 3.1:-

- 3.11 take the money and run, however as announced there is now funding for 2018-19
- 3.12 investigate ways of saving money as above, not take it out of the reserve
- 3.13 putting it back to ESCC is not an option, little will occur followed by numberous complaints from the public
