The town council has had a busy year with policy writing, performance assessment and future planning to support the natural growth of our town.

Projects for 2017 were costly, both financially and in terms of reputation. We acknowledge we had seasonal issues with antisocial behaviour from a few less considerate individuals, we began initial repairs to the water leak at Centenary Park and we dealt with flooding in one of our community buildings — those we trust are in the past.

From this month we have a number of exciting projects due to commence. These will be more positive, more visible and we trust appreciated by you all.

We have pledged to continue to improve and maintain the facilities in some of our beautiful parks, to provide new swings and play equipment, to install new seating for those who want to relax and appreciate our beautiful views and we are implementing our Active Peacehaven campaign.

We are working with a number of partners to support residents to keep



healthy, focusing on health and wellbeing, as well as providing additional resource for the GP surgeries, community groups and charities.

We hope you will support the fitness sessions run by a personal trainer, come along to the new cycle hub, try out the skatepark and have fun in our upcoming forest school.

Community House at the Meridian Centre is receiving a makeover, starting with much-needed structural repairs and more comfortable seating in the community café. This goes from strength to strength and we hope you will continue to support our markets and charities who raise much-needed funds here. Room hire charges are costeffective and we do not intend to increase them for 2018.

We will be running various events in partnership with the Meridian Shopping Centre, starting in January with a bric-abrac and jumble sale, followed by a flower show, fashion showcase and revisiting our successful careers fair.

We are in the process of running public competitions and consultations to ask residents where they feel would most benefit from improved facilities.

We hope this will feed into the coming year's plans for developing the services and amenities our residents really want in the town.

We have such a supportive network of volunteers in Peacehaven, not just the newly established charity Task Force but our own community garden, a Peacehaven community orchard, a horticultural society, Peacehaven bees, tea clubs, music and other fun activities.

We intend those to develop and grow, to encourage more members of the community to join in and truly feel part of what the town has to offer.

Finally, our plans for a hub building will be revealed. This year is definitely going to be a year of achievement, of community and fun. We look forward to working with you.

Peacehaven Focus Group is pleased a plan to build 450 homes at Lower Hoddern Farm has been deferred. The group, which campaigns about issues affecting residents, hopes district and county councillors will now be prompted to find what it considers to be proper solutions to the problem of traffic congestion on the A259.

More than 200 residents attended a meeting at Community House in Peacehaven to make their views known to Lewes District Council Planning Committee.

A recommendation from planning officers to approve the project was voted down by four votes to two.

A second proposal to defer a decision until East Sussex County Council, Brighton & Hove City Council and Brighton & Hove Buses look to improve their transport plan for the coast road was agreed by five votes to two.

Looking ahead to 2018, among the key issues for the focus group is coastal erosion, ongoing from last year in as much as the district council has its coastal management implementation scheme to keep residents informed about the condition of the coastline between Brighton Marina and Newhaven.

The focus group believes more public consultation events will be held this year to explain the problems faced and possible solutions.

The group will attend any meetings and report back to members and is encouraging residents to attend.

The Peacehaven and Telscombe Neighbourhood

Plan began in earnest in 2017. Initial meetings were held with interested community groups, councillors, etc.

It is hoped this will take off in 2018 and members of the focus group will be active in this.

Many of you will recall The Big Petition that was signed by more than 17,000 residents.

It requested the three councils concerned with the A259 coast road carry out a robust traffic survey and an economic impact study.

The focus group was disappointed that East Sussex County Council did not support the petition but is encouraged to learn the three authorities will work together to find solutions to the problems on the A259.

• Prepare your home. Keep a torch handy and have your appliances serviced by a Gas

Safe-registered engineer to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.

• Register as a vulnerable customer. Vulnerable households can get extra support by signing up to the Priority Services Register. Follow this link to find out more about the register or to sign up.

• Keep your eyes open. Watch the weather forecasts and if you have a power cut or a gas emergency, check on your neighbours.
