GIRLS' football academy launched by Peacehaven & Telscombe FC got off to a flyer with about 25 at the first session. Chance to speak up for youngsters

Peacehaven Youth Mayor Fatma Bacha has been elected Deputy Member of the UK Youth Parliament for the Eastbourne and Coastal area.

The parliament is a non-party-political organisation run by young people for young people. It provides opportunities for 11 to 18-year-olds to use their voices in creative ways to bring about social change at local and national level.

Once elected, they run campaigns and aim to influence decision-makers on issues which matter most to young people. The Sussex members and deputies are elected from within East Sussex Youth Cabinet.

"Working closely with the other representatives from around East Sussex for the next year, I plan on contributing locally to the young people's mental health campaign — supporting the youth, parents and carers in East Sussex.

"This fits well with my Youth Mayor commitment to promote the wellbeing and citizenship of young people in Peacehaven and East Sussex.

"Now that I have been elected a deputy for the youth parliament my journey continues. I want to help tackle knife crime nationally.

"Being Youth Mayor has been influential in me being elected. Now my involvement in the parliament and youth cabinet will benefit and support my aim to raise the voice of youth to a higher level nationally."



It is an oft-repeated cliché that young people are the future but I would say the Youth Strike last month put that notion to bed. Young people are not our future, they are our present. I was immensely heartened to see a new generation take to the streets of Brighton to demand serious action on climate change.

All too often we hear that young people are lazy, apathetic, that they do not care about politics. What clearer rejection of that notion could there be than more than 1,000 young people assembling on a freezing February morning to peacefully call on the Government to declare a climate emergency and take active steps to tackle the problem?

Despite the derision of the out-of-touch for "bunking off" school it is in fact those deriders who have shirked their responsibility, to our climate and our youth.

Climate change is perhaps the defining

issue of our time and it is our young people who will pay the price if we drop the ball and fail to tackle it. We are 11 years or so away from climate disaster, according to the UN. Climate disaster has the potential to destabilise entire regions of the world and create climate refugees on a level never seen before. It is vital we get this right and to our shame we are failing.

There will be other opportunities in the near future for young people to get involved in the campaign for action against climate change and I would encourage everyone to play their part in this important campaign.

Councillors, who put aside, on average, three hours a week for council work, are the champions of their community and give residents a voice on decisions the council makes.

Becoming a town councillor will allow you to engage with residents, groups and businesses, make decisions on which services and projects the council should take forward and become involved to ensure services are meeting your community's needs.

You can either stand as an independent or as a candidate for a group or political party.

A councillor's role and responsibilities include:

- Representing the ward for which they are elected.
- Decision-making.
- Developing and reviewing council policy.
- Community leadership and engagement. You do not need any special skills or

experience to be a councillor. It is important that councils have councillors who not only reflect and represent the communities they serve but also have a broad range of skills and life experience.

You do not have to be highly educated or have a profession. The skills you have gained through raising a family, caring for others, volunteering or being active in faith or community groups can be just as valuable.
