# Legal Eagle

## CHRISTMAS SHOPPING – AND THE LAW!

There is lots to enjoy at Christmas - quality time with family and loved ones.

It is also an expensive season. Festive cheer can be dampened if a gift turns out to be defective!

The Consumer Rights Act 2015 assists implying that goods sold will:-

- 1) be of "satisfactory" quality interpreted as of a reasonable standard taking into account price, etc.
- 2) "fit for purpose" the purpose for which those goods are generally used.

#### Remedies include:

- (a) "the short-term right to reject" this is a right to return defective goods and seek a refund this right lasts only 14 days.
- (b) A right to repair, replacement or price reduction.
- (c) In cases of purchases funded by a credit card (not a debit card or Amex) you may have additional remedies against the finance company.

#### Remember:

- · Keep proof of purchase.
- · Act quickly on discovering a defect.
- Consider purchasing expensive items on a credit card.

This can be a simple summary of the law only.

#### Christmas tree recycling

If you're enjoying a real Christmas tree this year, don't forget to recycle it. Just bring it along to Piddinghoe Avenue car park by Sunday 19 January for it to be collected and recycled locally into soil conditioner.

#### **Christmas leftovers**

Planning ahead for your Christmas meals can help cut down on waste and save you money, but all your peelings and food scraps can be recycled via separate food waste collections. If you aren't already part of the scheme head to leweseastbourne.gov.uk/FoodWaste to order your starter kit in time for Christmas.

#### **Christmas wrapping**

Christmas cards and wrapping paper can usually be recycled, except plastic or metallic ones – scrunch it up in your hand and if it stays scrunched then it can be recycled! Remember to remove any bows, ribbons or other decorations as these can't be recycled, but they can often be saved for next year.

#### **Christmas bin collections**

All Christmas recycling and garden waste collections will be carried out as shown on your collection calendar. Check changes to non-recyclable rubbish collections or download your recycling calendar online at lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk/BinDay.

With Christmas just around the corner, i would just like to take this opportunity for a timely seasonal reminder about "Drink Driving", or being under the influence of any other substance.

Firstly, consider the impact an accident may have on not just you, but other people. Drink if you want to, but get a taxi or any other mode of transport home. Do not get behind the wheel of a car if you have been drinking or Sussex Police will maybe having words.

Remember if you have a house full of presents, do not leave them on display. That is an invitation for an opportunist burglar if you are not home. Keep valuables out of sight and please ensure that you have adequate security measures in place around your home.

Do you have an elderly neighbour living alone next to you? How about doing the right thing and checking on their safety, security and welfare over the Christmas period. There are far too many vulnerable people within our communities with no one to help them.

# LEWES DISTRICT CITIZENS ADVICE 12 TIPS FOR CHRISTMAS:



- 1) Plan early: Plan how much you are going to spend on each person and stick to it.
- 2) Don't forget everyday bills: It may be Christmas, but keep on top of priority bills, such as rent and council tax.
- 3) Think twice about overdrafts: Don't run up an overdraft without first chatting to your bank
- 4) Keep it simple: Pay for your goods with cash or a debit card if you can.
- 5) Shop around: Look for the best price and buy only what you want, not what others say you need.
- 6) Avoid unauthorised lenders: Borrowing from loan sharks is never a good idea
- 7) ... and unauthorised traders: Whatever the deal, don't buy from unauthorised traders
- 8) Read the small print: Check credit agreements for hidden extras and work out the total amount to repay.
- 9) Do your own credit checks: If you plan to use a credit card, shop around
- 10) Be organised: If you've borrowed, repayment will be due before you know it. Make sure you make at least the minimum repayment or you'll be hit with charges.
- 11) Start planning for next Christmas: It may sound crackers, but just after Christmas is the best time to start saving.
- 12) Get help if you're worried: We can give you solid, free and impartial debt advice online, over the phone and face-to-face.
