From The Mayor

Dear Peacehaven residents,

I hope you started the new year very well and are back to your daily routine after the excitement of the festive season.

In Peacehaven Town Council, we had an early start and I am pleased to confirm that at its meeting on 14 January 2020, the Council resolved to adopt its budget for the 2020/21 financial year and to request a Council Tax Requirement from Lewes District Council.

We know how accountable we are to you, and in making its decision the Council considered your previous feedback and queries. We also considered the need to fully engage with other authorities and take advantage of new opportunities to bring funding and appropriate development to the Town. In practical terms, there will be an increase in the Council Tax of approximately £1.71 per household (Band D equivalent), per month.

Speaking to you recently, I understand that you are frustrated and want to know more about what is going on with the Meridian Centre. Peacehaven Town Councillors and staff are equally frustrated at not being able to give you more details about what is happening, and we know that this is negatively affecting local businesses and residents.

What we know is that the Co-Op estates group is seeking bids to buy its assets on this site and that an initial bid by Lewes District Council had been rejected. This lack of feedback is due to the commercial confidentiality required in such matters. We have written to the Co-Op to express the need to be fully informed in order to better communicate with you. We will make sure that any future news is publicised as soon as it is received.

We also take note of your concerns regarding the reduced service on Bus 14C and will liaise with relevant stakeholders to make sure your views are heard.

It gives me courage and hope to see how well councillors and staffs are working together to help the Mayor fundraise for its charities. Please kindly note the following up-coming events:

- Bingo 21st February and 6th March.
- African Night, with full entertainment & wonderful food on 22nd February
- Wrestling event on 14th March.

As you see, there are many challenges and we must thank the Council staff and Councillors for their determination to work together to deliver the best possible outcome to you. I must also thank you for your patience and support to all events organised so far.

At the beginning of January a leak by Southern Water at the Rottingdean crossroads caused absolute chaos for commuters. Many of you couldn't get to work and some waited in traffic for hours. Although on this occasion the traffic was caused by an accident, many of us who use the A259 know that the road is simply not up to scratch.

The Government has set up a strategic oversight body called Transport for the South East which after lobbying have now upgraded the A259 to a major road in their strategic planning. After the latest incident I have asked for a further meeting with representatives from Local Council and Transport for the South East to ask what more can done to alleviate pressure on the A259.

I will update residents when I have more information, there is not going to be any easy solution but after years of neglect it is time we started having a coordinated response to this problem that seems to be only getting worse.



This Peacehaven day centre has been running for more than 50 years

Kempton House Day Centre, in Cavell Avenue, Peacehaven prepares lunch three times a week and organises quizzes, games, discussions, and outings regularly for its members. Transportation is also provided by the centre.

ONLINE PARCEL DELIVERY

citizens advice

Does this sound familiar? I bought a present from an online store and paid extra for next day delivery; it hasn't arrived. I tried to contact the delivery company but couldn't speak to anyone. The online store said my parcel is with the delivery company and should arrive soon. If it doesn't arrive soon, I don't want it. What can I do?

You paid for next day delivery so your goods should be delivered on the agreed date. Because you bought something from a business to be delivered to you, it's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered.

As the seller used a courier, they should chase the courier to find out what's happened to your order. Under the Consumer Rights Act, you can ask the seller to deliver the item again if the item wasn't delivered by the agreed date.

Or:

Cancel your original order and reorder it again from the same or a new online store Check if a local store stocks the item(s)

Keep trying to contact the delivery company via tracking tools/phone/email

To cancel your order:Cancel and ask for your money back because you haven't received your goods on the agreed date. Tell the seller that what has happened to your order is "a breach of contract under the Consumer Rights Act 2015" - as the delivery date was essential and they didn't meet it.
