

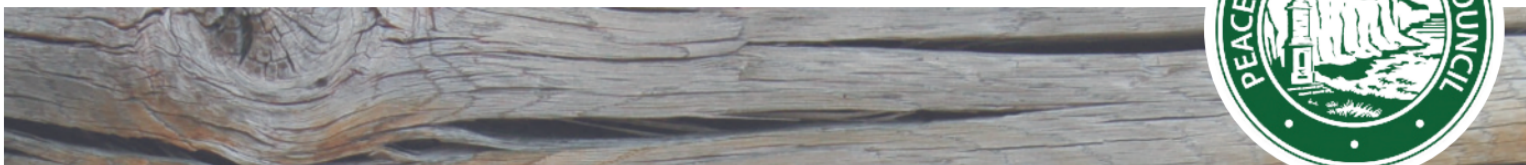

Dear Residents of Peacehaven,

Since the lifting of some of the Covid-19 restrictions, we have seen a small spike in Anti-social Behaviour, around the Meridian Centre in particular. This can manifest itself from petty crime, as in shoplifting, to antagonising and threatening behaviour towards the security staff there.

None of which are pleasant for anyone to have to deal with. As a parent, do you know who your kids are hanging around with and what they are getting up to? Let's be honest, the majority of kids are only doing what teenagers have done through the ages and no one has a problem with that.

But there is a small element in the town that if your children "Hang out" with, will no doubt lead your children to come to the attention of the Police. So what we tend to get at the Meridian is a couple of youths who cause the problems and a large group of "Hangers-on".

Don't let your kids take the fall for what others are doing. Better still, point them in the direction of perhaps the Joff youth Club, or any other relevant distraction that will have a positive, rather than negative outcome for them.

I am very pleased that the government has reversed their decision but I remain concerned that due to the timings of the grades it has meant many students have missed out on their preferred university places.

I have written to the Vice-Chancellors of Brighton University and Sussex University to seek assurances that students will not be disadvantaged and I know colleagues around the country have done similar with other universities.

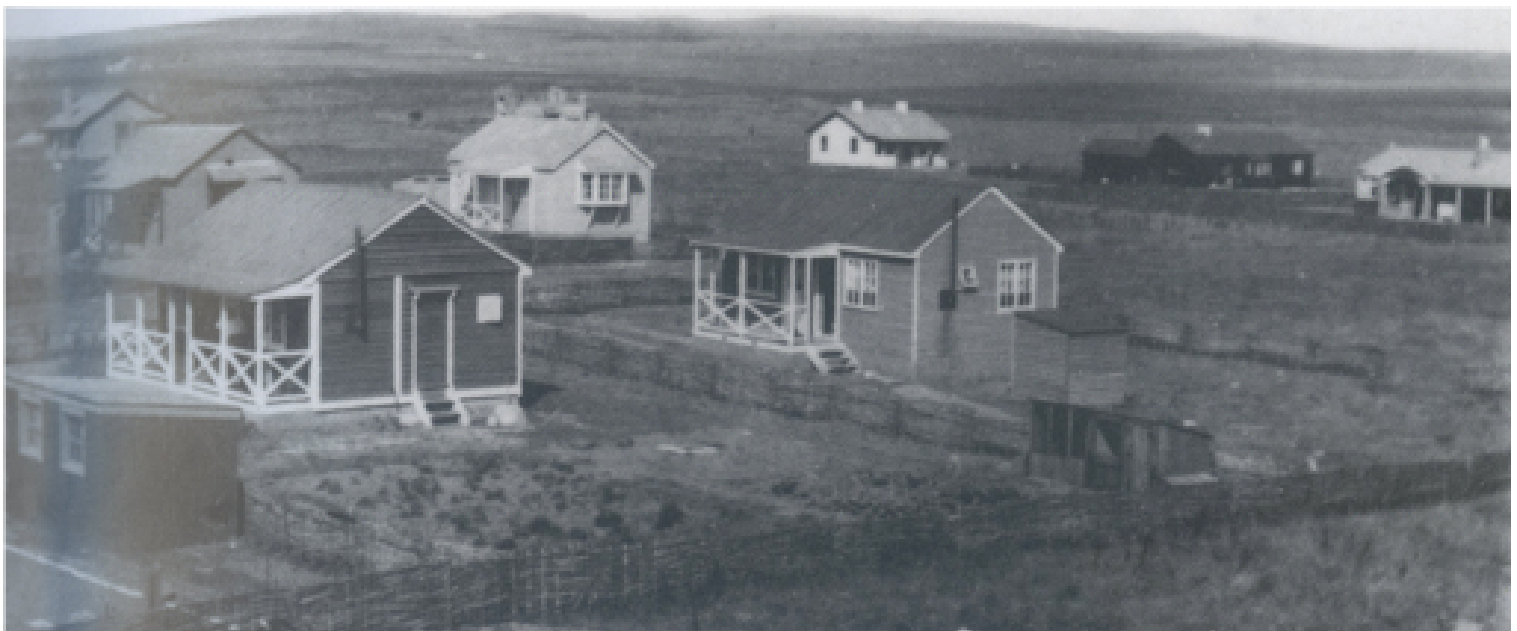
2020 MARKS ANOTHER CENTENARY FOR PEACEHAVEN

October 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the first new homes being built on the actual Peacehaven Estate, which was nestled between the Telscombe Cliffs Estate (founded by the Cavendish Company in 1901) and the Friars Bay Smallholding Cooperative Colony (founded by Arthur Harrison in 1911).

The Peacehaven Estate, which itself was founded in 1916, was originally called New Anzac on Sea, but was renamed Peacehaven in February 1917. Peacehaven therefore can rightly claim three centenary anniversaries: 2016 marked the 100th anniversary of the Estate's genesis; 2017 was the anniversary of it being called Peacehaven; and this October will be the 100th anniversary of the first homes having been completed and sold.

Built by Neville's South Coast Land Resort Company, these were modest one-bedroom timber framed structures, with small verandas and outhouses (for a WC). These homes were all located on the north side of the South Coast Road on Seaview Avenue.

Brighton-born Frank Parks, who worked as a carpenter on the Estate for many years and was also a keen photographer documented the homes' construction. Parks also moved to the Estate in 1922 and remained in Peacehaven until his death in 1992.

Every second Thursday of the Month at 7pm Residents meet as the Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group (NDPSG) to continue with the progress of the Plan. During the Covid 19 emergency, physical contact has been limited so the meetings have been virtual via Zoom.

We are hopeful that in late September through to Christmas we will be able to share and consult further with the Communities.

Henry Davidson Developments ,who are the preferred developers for the COOP at the Meridian Centre and they are with their Architects working with Lewes District Council (the Planning Authority) on a plan for a new Town Centre for Peacehaven.

They are aware of the emerging NDP and the Vision and Objectives the Steering Group are following. The Vision "A sustainable Neighbourhood ,with clean air and an environment which provides a good quality of life for all inhabitants"

Key Objectives

1. A refocused Town Centre at the Meridian Site including ,leisure, food and drink outlets , small business units all essentials for sustainable living.
2. Safe pedestrian walkways and cycleways accessing all areas within the built environment and giving access to the countryside.
3. Low air quality ratings and climate change risks managed
4. New housing aimed at low needs including low cost, long term rentals.

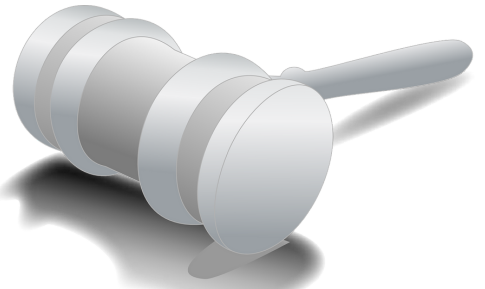

BECOME A MAGISTRATE



There is a shortage of Magistrates in the area and country wide. Below is a short insight of what would be expected of you if you applied for the post. Magistrates are ordinary people who volunteer to sit in court.

Magistrates (also called Justices of the Peace) are unpaid volunteers and come from a wide range of backgrounds and occupations – from bus drivers to architects, pilots to mechanics, nursery nurses to retired people, unemployed to teachers. They are ordinary men and women with common sense and personal integrity. They are able to listen to all sides of an argument and can contribute to fair and reasonable decisions. You do not have to have any legal qualification. Magistrates sit as one of a bench of three, including one who sits in the centre who has been trained to take the chair, called the Presiding Justice. They deal with a range of criminal cases such as minor theft, criminal damage, public disorder and motoring offences.

Our members also sit in youth and family courts.

Ten quick facts about magistrates:

- Magistrates can be appointed from the age of 18 but have to retire at 70
- Magistrates are also called Justices of the Peace and are allowed to use the suffix JP after the name (there are some occasions when this is not appropriate e.g. candidates in elections, business purposes to gain advantage). Generally the suffix is not used.
- Magistrates are not paid but may claim expenses
- Magistrates are not legally qualified but are carefully and continually trained and have the benefit of a legal adviser in court
- Magistrates use sentencing guidelines and case law to assist them to reach decisions about sentencing – this ensures continuity throughout the country
- Magistrates can choose to sit at the magistrates' court near to their home or their work
- There is approximately the same number of male and female magistrates
- All magistrates take the judicial oath when they are sworn in: I will well and truly serve our Sovereign Lady Queen Elizabeth the Second, in the office of Justice of the Peace and I will do right to all manner of people after the laws and usages of the realm without fear or favour, affection or ill-will
- Once appointed, magistrates are allocated a mentor for their first year to help and support them
- Magistrates can be removed from the bench if it is found that their behaviour is not that expected of a magistrate

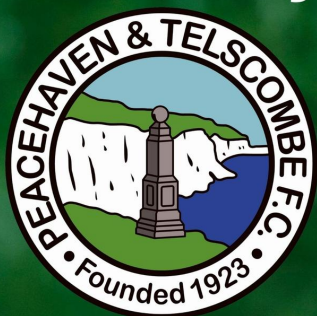




ACADEMY FOOTBALL RESUMES AT PEACEHAVEN & TELSCOMBE FC
