HOW TO CARVE THE PERFECT PUMPKIN

- 1. Choose a large pumpkin and use a sharp serrated knife to cut off the crown.
- 2. Using a large serving spoon, scoop out the seeds and fibres and discard. Then remove some of the flesh.
- 3. With a marker pen, draw a simple outline of a face on the pumpkin. Use a small serrated knife to cut out the eyes, nose and mouth. Always cut away from you in case the knife slips.
- 4. Pop a tea light inside the pumpkin, light it and replace the crown.

Ensure there is an adult with you at all times when using the carving knife

PUMPKIN SOUP RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 large onion, coarsely chopped
- 1 (1.8kg.) pumpkin
- 4 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 low-salt chicken or vegetable stock Salt

Freshly ground black pepper

120 ml double cream, plus more for garnish (optional)

DIRECTIONS:

In a heavy soup pot or casserole dish over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and garlic and cook until golden.

Meanwhile, halve, peel, and scrape out seeds of the pumpkin. Cut into chunks.

Add pumpkin chunks and stock to pot. Season with salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, uncovered, then reduce heat to a simmer. Simmer until pumpkin is forktender, about 30 minutes.

Remove pot from heat and, using an immersion blender, blend mixture until smooth. (Alternatively, let soup cool, then blend in a blender.) Stir in cream and season to taste.

To serve, ladle soup into bowls, add a swirl of cream, and garnish with pepper.

Do you own a motor bike or a scooter?

If so, are you taking security measures to ensure that the bike remains as your property?

Peacehaven seems to be "Bike Theft Central" at the moment, with bikes being stolen to either be "Sold on", or being used for joy riding around the town.

We, at Sussex Police, have a good idea who is committing the crime, but everything needs to be backed up by solid evidence. So a hunch or assumption will not stand up in court.

Have you seen any unusual behaviour around these vehicles, or a neighbour's teenage son having more bikes than he can possibly have a use for? If you have seen anything suspicious, please contact the Police via the 101 number.

For those of you that own bikes, please try and make it as difficult as possible to have your bike stolen. Use a significant lock and chain, or for the more Tech savvy of you, perhaps install a tracking device, there seem to be some reasonably priced ones on the Internet currently.

Regarding the Covid-19, hopefully before long I can get out for regular foot patrols in the town and see you all again.

TOP SAFE CYCLING TIPS... TO KEEP YOUR CHILD SAFE ON THE ROADS



- · Ensure children wear a fitted cycle helmet
- Young cyclists should always wear light-coloured, fluorescent and reflective clothing to help them to be seen, as well as having lights on their bike, particularly when cycling at night.
- Investigate the density of the traffic and any problems on the route before considering letting your child out unsupervised
- Before your child sets off on their own, travel the route with them a few times so that they are confident and familiar with where they'll be going. You may wish to cycle behind them for a few weeks to build their confidence
- If your child is cycling to a friend's house, let another adult know and give them an idea of when they can expect your child to arrive

With very little income, the Council's finances remain under close and continuous scrutiny and we are making savings in as many areas as possible. It will soon be time to start looking at the budget for 2021/22, which for this year promises to be a very interesting exercise indeed. I can assure you that the impact on residents' Council Tax bills is at the forefront of our considerations.

Regarding the redevelopment of the Meridian Centre, discussions are continuing with the Co-Op's chosen developer HDD and we are liaising with our partner Councils (Lewes District Council & East Sussex County Council) so that we can have as much influence on this development as possible. We will make sure that there is proper public consultation, particularly when the developer comes forward with any formal plans.

Last month we were pleased to welcome Michelle Edser to the Council team as our new Senior Projects Officer. Among ither things, Michelle will be leading on the Meridian Centre redevelopment and seeking additional income streams to help bolster the Council's finances.

FROM THE MP LLOYD RUSSELL-MOYLE

I was disgusted at the act of public vandalism by the Interim Board of Governors at Peacehaven Heights School when they filled in the school's swimming pool. Many residents of Peacehaven and Telscombe will have learnt to swim in that pool and it leaves our community without any similar facility for future generations.

It has been claimed that the pool had become too expensive to maintain but no figures have been released to substantiate that claim, further I have not been told if a temporarily draining of the pool was considered rather than the permanent act of filling it in.

It's been reported residents had, over the years, raised more than £100,000 for the operation of the pool. This was a community asset and should not have been destroyed without a proper consultation.

I have urgently written to the Interim Board of Governors asking for answers to these and other questions. It is simply not good enough for there to be no accountability over these decisions and I am calling for East Sussex County Council to step in and take over the management of the school.

DROWNING IN DEBT?

2020 MARKS ANOTHER CENTENARY FOR PEACEHAVEN

October 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the first new homes being built on the Peacehaven Estate, which was nestled between the Telscombe Cliffs Estate (founded by the Cavendish Company in 1901) and the Friars Bay Smallholding Cooperative Colony (founded by Arthur Harrison in 1911).

The Peacehaven Estate was founded in 1916, and originally called New Anzac on Sea, before being renamed Peacehaven in February 1917. Peacehaven therefore rightly can claim three centenary anniversaries! 2016 marked the 100th anniversary of the Estate's genesis and inception. 2017 was the anniversary of it being named Peacehaven. And this October will be the 100th anniversary of the first houses having been completed and sold.

Built by Charles Neville's South Coast Land Resort Company, these homes were modest one-bedroom timber framed structures, with small verandas and outhouses. They were all located on the north side of the South Coast Road on Seaview Avenue.

Brighton-born Frank Parks, who worked as a carpenter on the Estate for many years, was also a keen photographer and he documented the homes' construction. Parks himself moved to the Estate in 1922 and stayed there until his death in 1992.

These bungalows and their new owners were listed in the first Peacehaven directory published in 1923. On the west side of Seaview Avenue, this included the Wagstaff family at The Bronte (Jack Wagstaff was the first baby born on the Estate in 1920); and on the east side a Miss Cannaway at PAX HOLT.

Unfortunately, none of the homes built in 1920 remain today. However, PAX HOLT, built in 1921, still stands and has recently been very sympathetically renovated.
