REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 8TH NOVEMBER 2020

This year Remembrance Day, on 8th November will be different from other years, we will not be organising a parade or a long service; we will be following Government advice regarding social gatherings so we will be advising our local organisations and residents **NOT** to gather at the War Memorial, due to COVID-19 restrictions.

We will not be inviting guests to attend the short service at the War Memorial site at 11.00am. The **ONLY** attendees at this time will be The Mayors of both Peacehaven & Telscombe Town Councils, the Royal British Legion representative accompanied by the standard bearer, our local bugler, and the Rev'd Tim Mills, Peacehaven Town Council will video the short service at a distance and will post on our Social Media sites. This decision has been made to avoid social gatherings; we are following Government advice.

We would however, like to invite, dignitaries and our local organisations to lay their wreaths after 11.20am. Those who would like to lay a wreath on behalf of their organisation or group will be given a time slot to visit the war memorial, in a safe capacity and at their own risk. It is suggested that sanitiser is used after laying the wreath, please bring this with you when visiting the site. Please contact Deborah Donovan, Civic Officer (civicandmarketing@peacehaventowncouncil.gov.uk) who will allocate you with a time to lay your wreath.

If a poppy wreath is required for Ceremonial Laying at the War Memorial, please contact the Royal British Legion Poppy Organiser Stephen Redman on 01273 587599 who will arrange a safe collection point.

There has been a lot of speculation on social media regarding Armistice Day too, unfortunately, we won't be inviting schools or organisations to attend the short service on 11th November, however, residents can visit to pay their respects at any time after 11.15am taking into consideration social distancing and gathering in numbers. Peacehaven Town Council will video the short service and will post on their social media sites.

We would like our residents to Remember at Home this year and are fully supporting the idea of placing pictures of poppies in windows which could also be a fabulous idea for the schools to take on board too. Peacehaven Town Council are working with the Co-op Funeral Care (Caring Lady) who have donated material for the Sussex Volunteer Crafters to make 'Poppy' face masks. These are on sale in the Information Office, priced at just £2.50, all funds will be donated to the Royal British Legion.

If there is an outbreak of COVID-19 in the Town, then all procedures may be cancelled at a moment's notice. Thank you in advance for your support with these changes.

From The Mayor

Dear Residents,

A couple of weeks ago I was invited to the Chalker's Rise development. The visit was an opportunity for me to see the development first-hand following the success of its first phase, which is over 86% reserved. I was able to ask questions raised by some of our residents, especially regarding transport and access. Barratt's are committed to engaging with both the council and residents, they wish to interact and keep the dialog flowing. The following are a couple of questions with answers which I put to Lynnette St-Quintin:

Easy access into development

The main entrance into Chalkers Rise is now fully complete, meaning that access into and out of the development is easy for our residents. As with any new building site, there was some minor disruption to be expected near the entrance to the development, however this issue has naturally resolved as construction has moved deeper into the site and away from the main road. We make sure to have regular dialogue with our residents and local stakeholders to ensure that we are aware of any issues that might crop up and ensure that we can resolve these quickly.

Public transport

As part of our wider sustainable travel plan at Chalkers Rise, we have introduced various schemes to encourage our new residents to use eco-friendly alternative modes of transport. We have provided our residents with a 6-month free bus pass, and each new household is offered up to £100 towards the purchase of a new bicycle. Additionally, we are in the process of setting up a 'Car Club', a service which will encourage residents to car share wherever possible.

Is there a regular contact on site for residents & councillors to contact to enhance good relations? Tom Betts, the site manager at Chalkers Rise, is always willing and able to listen to any concerns from residents and councillors alike and will assist wherever possible. A selection of Christmas masks will be available to buy too, this in aid of the food bank fund.



PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON MASTERPLAN FOR NEW PEACEHAVEN TOWN CENTRE ON MERIDIAN SITE



Please note that the plan shown is a high level aspirational vision to test out residents views.

A masterplan has been published for a new Peacehaven town centre on the Meridian site and a consultation has been launched by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group to get the public's views. The consultation can be completed online by visiting: www.peacehaventowncouncil.gov.uk/neighbourhood-plan

The masterplan, created by consultant's AECOM, includes design ideas for commercial, public and residential buildings to contribute in the region of 100 homes to the town's statutory requirement, set by Lewes District Council, to provide a minimum of 255 housing units by 2030.

The aim of the masterplan is to improve the design of the area, make it more sustainable and a better place to live and work. The consultation is asking residents for views on a range of options, which include:

- Development of supermarket and shops
- · Creating public squares and community spaces for cultural events
- Improving ease of use of the site
- Building new residential properties
- Providing space potentially for outdoor food and drink, youth activities and office use

Cathy Gallagher, Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group said, "We have passed on resident's views from the initial survey and have already pushed back on the heights of the buildings and the number of housing units from 320 to 123. We now feel that the final version of the masterplan meets some of the designated housing needs and the main aspirations of the residents, which were set out in the initial consultation survey in 2019."

The closing date for comments is Friday December 18th. The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will then write a summary report setting out the residents' comments and findings for the Meridian Site, which will be used to shape the Neighbourhood Planning policies for the area. The summary report will be completed and available for residents to look at in February 2021.

The masterplan is designed to set out resident's ambitions for the site and is not a planning application. The Meridian site is currently the subject of a redevelopment proposal and by setting out aspirations for this area the Steering Group hopes that developers will look at the masterplan and take some of the ideas on board as they design the site.

Citizens Advice tips on keeping energy bills down now the weather is turning and the heating bills are going to go up, particularly if you are not going back into the office before January

There's lots you can do to keep bills down.

Firstly, see if you can get a better deal by changing your energy supplier. Compare prices and check their customer service record before switching. The Citizens Advice has a price comparison tool on our website, and star rating to assess the customer service records of the 40 biggest companies.

Also look at those everyday things that can help; switch off televisions and other devices overnight, do not leave them on standby; wash clothes on a lower temperature; and only boil the kettle with the water you need.

A way of cutting costs long term is to invest in good insulation - or ask your landlord to do so.

If your pay is close to the national minimum wage, the extra costs of working from home could be counted as a pay cut and bring you below the legal level. Talk to your manager, HR department, or your union rep.

Finally, your employer should pay for costs connected to your health and safety while working from home. Check the company Expenses Policy; you may be able to claim for other things e.g. suitable chair for computer work, printer ink or telephone line rental.
