

FROM THE MP-LLOYD RUSSELL-MOYLE

We hopefully have light at the end of the tunnel when it comes to this awful pandemic but now more than ever we need to redouble our efforts to ensure we minimise the effects of the virus on our health service.

At the time of writing Sussex County Hospital has reached capacity of critical care beds.

I have been assured that the NHS is still coping and if you need medical care please call 111 for nonemergencies or 999 for emergencies.

I have been having regular meetings with the NHS and the Council regarding the vaccine roll-out and we have started to massively expand capacity for the delivery of the vaccine. The NHS would like to remind everyone that you will be contacted by your GP when it is your turn to receive your vaccine. They are starting with the most at risk groups, being the over 80's and NHS workers.

The Government have pledged to vaccinate 15 million people by mid-February and it is a goal I am going to hold them to in Parliament. In the meantime we need to stay inside and minimise all contact to ensure we can relieve the pressure on the NHS. I hope by the summer life can begin to return to normal but until then please stay safe everyone.






PEACEHAVEN IN 1921

One hundred years ago, at the start of 1921, Peacehaven had barely a handful of houses and a mere 24 permanent residents but the air was filled with the noise of hundreds of workmen and tradesmen building new homes. The men were glad of the work as there was mass unemployment throughout the country. By 1925, the landscape was peppered with bungalows and the population had risen to around 3,500. Today the population of the town exceeds 15,000.

Charles Neville, the founder of Peacehaven, hoped that this bit of coastal countryside could be turned into a 'garden city by the sea' and his futuristic dreams were illustrated in early promotional brochures and advertisements such as the one shown. The artwork was by one of Neville's employees, Gordon Volk, son of the inventor Magnus Volk. The potential of this new resort encouraged hundreds to acquire plots; the building materials, labour and services were provided largely by Neville's numerous companies. Sadly, the envisaged tower, railway station, bandstand, beach huts and bathing machines never came to fruition.




However, 1921 did see the construction of a feature that would enable the Peacehaven pioneers and their families to have easy access to the rocky foreshore and the sea – the Bastion and Bastion Steps. In the 1930's, a concrete beach pool was added, the water being refreshed with every tide, but this fell into disrepair during the second world war and was later demolished. The Bastion disappeared when the Undercliff was built in the late 1970's but the original Bastion Steps are still there, cutting down through the cliff, largely unchanged. The popularity of the Bastion and Bastion Steps is perhaps reflected in the huge number of postcards in which they have featured.

The year 1921 also saw the publication of the first edition of The Peacehaven Post, a wonderful monthly magazine, delivered for 4 shillings a year. Under the guiding hand of Charles Neville promoting his infant 'Garden City', it was edited by George Powell. He and his brother Felix Powell, the composer of 'Pack up your troubles in your old kit bag', were both residents of Peacehaven, and together, wrote a song entitled 'Come to Peacehaven' in 1921. The magazine was filled with local news, sport, adverts of local businesses, Gordon Volk's cartoons, anecdotes, poems, residents' contributions, photos of the latest houses, and articles promoting the health benefits of the town where we now live.

Thank you to all those who responded to the survey on the masterplan for the centre of Peacehaven the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) Steering Group has had a fantastic response and is currently collating everyone's views.

There have been many comments on Facebook and other platforms and an updated frequently asked questions document has been created which you can view here: (www.peacehaven-and-telscombe-neighbourhood-plan-steering-group.co.uk/post/masterplan-frequently-asked-questions) to respond to questions as they arise.

All the responses will be used to create a paper which will be used as an evidence document.

A pamphlet was delivered to every home in the plan area i.e. East Saltdean, Telscombe including Telscombe village and Peacehaven. Social media and websites were also used to promote the online survey. The pamphlet set out the background on the NDP and the concept possibility for land use on the Meridian Site.

We had planned a number of public events in 2020 to consult and make the community aware of the vision and aims of the NDP but of course these were overshadowed by COVID-19 regulations. However, on 11th February at 7pm we will be holding a public Zoom meeting, to enable any questions or comments to be addressed. The Co-op Group own the majority of the land on the Meridian Site and they have appointed a preferred developer - Henry Davidson Developments Limited (HDD).

citizens advice

Staff and volunteers at Lewes District Citizens Advice hear stories every day of families whose lives have been turned upside down by this pandemic.

Some had never needed support from the benefits system before, while others were already struggling to get by before Covid struck. In total we've given 665 people one-to-one advice on Universal Credit since the first lockdown in March. 49% of people seeking our support on benefits used our services for the very first time.

We know that the government's £20 a week boost to the Universal Credit at the start of the pandemic often made the difference between empty cupboards and food on the table.

But that lifeline is currently set to end in just a few short months. It's a cut that's likely to push people into missed bills, mounting debts and a daily struggle to make ends meet. It's a cut that will also drain spending power from our fragile economy.

With an ongoing pandemic and a bleak outlook in the jobs market, we're urging the government to keep that lifeline. It's the right thing to do to support people who've lost livelihoods through no fault of their own.

RAMPION 2 WIND FARM EXTENSION LAUNCHES FIRST CONSULTATION



Rampion 2 wind farm extension launches first consultation

An informal consultation has been opened seeking feedback on initial proposals to expand the Rampion Wind Farm off the Sussex coast. Rampion 2 could create clean, renewable electricity to power over one million homes in the UK in addition to Rampion's existing generation. Feedback from this first consultation will help refine more detailed proposals which will be prepared for a second consultation later this year.

An offshore 'Area of Search' is being assessed to identify the optimum site for a maximum of up to 116 turbines, the same number as the existing Rampion Offshore Wind Farm. A subsea export cable is proposed to bring the power ashore under Climping beach, with an underground onshore cable route required to bring the power inland to connect to the national transmission grid at Bolney, where three potential sites are being considered for a new substation.
