PEACEHAVEN TOWN COUNCIL KEY WORKER SPECIAL-

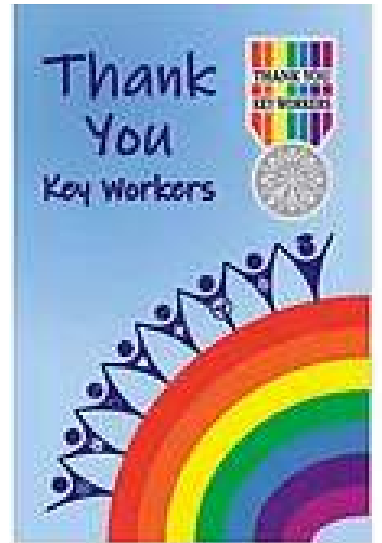
The outgoing Mayor of Peacehaven, Cllr Claude Cheta wanted to make a difference to our community by organising a presentation to some of our local key workers.
