CITIZENS ADVICE WARNS OF THE PERFECT STORM OF ENERGY BILL RISES AND UNIVERSAL CREDIT CUT

New analysis from Citizens Advice shows how rising energy bills will coincide with Universal Credit cuts this autumn, creating a perfect storm for families.

The charity's research is released as Ofgem announces £139 rise in default tariffs and £153 increase for prepayment meter customers.

The rise which takes effect in October will hit family budgets just at the same time as the government's planned cut of £20 a week to Universal Credit, which covers six days energy costs for a below-average income household, affecting 6 million homes.

It will also coincide with the end of the furlough scheme, which the charity warns could lead to further job losses and more families being pushed onto benefits.

The charity's new analysis shows that nearly 2 million households are already behind on their energy bills, even before the new price rise and planned Universal Credit cut - an increase of around 410,000 from before the pandemic.

More than one in four (28%) households in which someone receives Universal Credit are behind on their energy bill. Fuel debt was the most common debt problem so far, the charity says the numbers affected could worsen considerably later this year.

PROTECTING AND LINKING UP GREEN SPACES IN PEACEHAVEN AND TELSCOMBE







A priority for the Peacehaven and Telscombe Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG) is protecting and linking up the local public green spaces.

A report is currently being written by the NPSG that will give local parks and grounds official local green park status and protect them from housing and commercial development.

The main areas to be given protected status include:

- Centenary Park
- Epinay Park
- The Oval
- The Dell
- Howard/Peace Park
- Cornwall Avenue Allotments
- Shepherds Down
- Chatsworth Park
- Telscombe Recreation Ground
- The Copse

To achieve Local Green Spaces status they need to be demonstrably special. The 5 criteria for assessment are:

- Historical
- Beauty
- Tranquility
- Recreational Value
- Wildlife

Cathy Gallagher, Chair of the Peacehaven and Telscombe Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, "Green spaces give so much to all ages in terms of play, fun, enjoyment, well-being and happiness. It is vital that these sites are legally protected so that they can be enjoyed for many years to come."

GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER

Haven't the last few months flown by!

It's best to start dividing the herbaceous perennials now September is upon us.

You can collect and sow seed from the perennials and hardy annuals.

If you are lucky to have dahlias they may be at their best now and will give a lovely amount of colour to the garden.

You should still deadhead flowers to continue flowering.

Once you have had a good weeding in the garden you can put mulch around the plants with compost to protect them by keeping them warm.

If you have autumn raspberries you should pick them now.

Don't forget to dig up remaining potatoes before the slugs beat you to it and ruin them!

Now September is here you can clean out your greenhouse and cold frames so they will be ready in the Autumn for you to use.

It's now time to plant spring flowering bulbs ready for colour next year.

It may be September but don't forget to keep up with watering.

If you love to feed the birds don't forget they will love the seedheads.

Peacehaven Horticultural Society is a very friendly group and have been established for nearly 100 years and will be celebrating their centenary next year.

With Afghanistan collapsing we will be judged by our actions not our words. 9 Afghanis are due to attend Sussex University on the Chevening Scholarship Program in September, the Prime Minister was quick to say he would provide visas for all students due to attend British universities.

Yet almost a week on they were not given their 'Final Award Letter' which allows them to apply for their Visa, something I hope will be rectified soon.

It is not just the Chevening Scholars I am assisting but several other constituents who have family members trying to return to the UK.

How could anyone witness the scenes we see unfolding in Afghanistan and say that those trying to escape should be filing in the proper paperwork.

In the recall debate in the House of Commons on the 18th of August I called on the Government to airlift people to Cyprus or one of our other military bases to ensure the proper paperwork can be done.

Once this immediate crisis is over we need to reflect on how we got to this point. We can not continue to make the same mistakes when it comes to these disastrous interventions in the middle east.
