The town of Peacehaven is not only the point on the South Coast where the Greenwich Meridian enters and exits the country, but it also remains the only town in the UK to be named after peace. With its natural beauty, surrounding countryside and stunning coastal location, it is a community and town to be proud of which needs to be protected, cherished and sustained for future generations.

With this in mind, Peacehaven Town Council is hosting the first 'Towards Zero Carbon Peacehaven' event at The Meridian Centre from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday 9th April, to highlight and demonstrate the things – even the smallest of things – residents, local companies - in fact everyone - can all do to help the town move Towards Zero Carbon.

So, what exactly is Zero Carbon and what does it mean?

Councillor David Seabrook explains: "Zero Carbon means that no carbon emissions are being produced. Whereas traditional energy sources such as coal, gas, oil, petrol and diesel all produce Carbon Dioxide when they are burned as fuel to produce electricity or power your car or heat your home. Zero Carbon means that no carbon emissions are being produced.

"Of course, Zero Carbon is unrealistic which is why you hear about Net Zero Carbon or Carbon Neutral, where carbon emissions are offset through schemes such as tree planting.

"For example, changing to a renewable energy sources, such as wind or solar, will dramatically reduce carbon emissions – and let's not forget that renewable energy is now not only cleaner, but often cheaper than fossil fuels."

However, it's not only about energy. Carbon can also be reduced by simple actions, which can save you money, such as buying locally produced food, reducing emissions from transport by walking, cycling, using public transport and avoiding flying, buying less stuff; for example, thinking 'do you really need the latest smart phone or a new 72 inch TV?'

Towards Zero Carbon Peacehaven is sponsored by Rampion Offshore Wind and supported by The Big Lemon Bus Company who will be running a free electric bus around the town and Telscombe, helping to get people to and from the event.

In addition, the event will see a wide variety of stalls and exhibitors including Dr Bike, Sustrans, Enterprise Car Club, Cycling Without Age, Community Orchard and Garden, Energy Champions, Ovesco, Plastic Free Peacehaven, Greenhavens, Water Refill, Freegle, Lewes District Council, Water Blade and many more; all of whom will have attendees on hand to explain how we can make small changes that will help make a difference.

On 6th February this year, Her Majesty The Queen became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom (UK), the Realms and the Commonwealth.

To celebrate this exceptional anniversary, events and initiatives haven been taking place throughout the year which will all culminate in a four day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June.

This special bank holiday provides an excellent opportunity for communities and people throughout the country to come together to commemorate such a momentous and historic royal milestone and celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service.

So, what's taking place?

Thursday 2nd June

The Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour) will take place on Thursday 2nd June, with over 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians will come together in the traditional Parade to mark The Queen's official birthday, usually held on the second Saturday in June.

The Parade will start at Buckingham Palace and move down The Mall to Horse Guard's Parade. The procession will also include Members of the Royal Family on horseback and in carriages and will close with the traditional RAF fly-past, watched by The Queen and Members of the Royal Family from the Buckingham Palace balcony.

The UK has a long tradition of celebrating Royal Jubilees, Weddings and Coronations with the lighting of beacons, and the Platinum Jubilee is no exception. Over 1,500 beacons will be lit throughout the UK, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories. In addition, for the first time, beacons will also be lit in each of the capital cities of the Commonwealth with the Principal beacon being lit in a special ceremony at Buckingham Palace. **Peacehaven's beacon will be lit at 9:15 p.m. on Thursday 2nd June at the War** Memorial. Everyone is welcome to come along.



Friday 3rd June

On Friday 3rd June, there will be a Service of Thanksgiving for The Queen's reign at St. Paul's Cathedral.

Saturday 4th June

Her Majesty – accompanied by Members of the Royal Family - will attend The Derby at Epsom Racecourse. That evening, the BBC will be staging and broadcasting The Platinum Party at The Palace. This unique concert will bring together a wide variety of the world's biggest stars all united in celebrating The Queen's seven decade reign.

Sunday 5th June

On Sunday 5th June, The Big Jubilee Lunch will take place. The Big Jubilee Lunch is for everyone to celebrate not only their community and connections, but the coming together of neighbours, friends and family in the spirit of fun and friendship. Whether it's a cup of tea with a neighbour over the garden fence or a fun-filled street party, everyone is invited to have fun and get to know one another a little better.

Also on 5th June, The Platinum Jubilee Pageant will take place. Performers, military personnel, volunteers and key workers are uniting to tell the story of Her Majesty's 70 year reign in a jubilant festival of creativity.

Forming an important part of the Platinum Pageant will be the 'River of Hope,' which will comprise of two hundred silk flags appearing as a moving river down The Mall, depicting the hopes and ambitions of primary and secondary school children for the planet over the next 70 years.

FROM THE MP LLOYD RUSSELL-MOYLE



I always focus my monthly contributions to the E-News on local issues like the doctor's surgery, the Meridian development or the A259 but this month I wanted to talk about something happening internationally.

It has been heart-warming to see so many people coming together, especially in Peacehaven, to support the people of Ukraine during the war with Russia. I have been inundated with emails from people offering help, whether materially or those who can give refugees a roof over their heads. To see people in this town helping people in such an unfortunate situation is something everyone should be proud of.

Peacehaven Town Council passed a motion to condemn the war and call on East Sussex County Council to divest of any investments that can be linked to Russia, people are organising to take in abandoned animals and children, and the donations people are making to send to Ukraine and countries bordering it are a testament to the people of the town.

Too many Ukrainians are facing unacceptable bureaucratic hurdles to being reunited with their families here in the UK.

They are in the middle of a war zone and the government is still expecting them to file paperwork and attend visa appointments.

I will continue to call on the government to show compassion and kindness to the people of Ukraine in the way Peacehaven has, to help provide safety for those who need it.



Now this the time to sow new lawns and repair bare patches.

Plant summer flowering bulbs, you can also support perennials before they get too large.

When pruning perennials some plants benefit from having their flowering shoots thinned out.

Divide herbaceous perennials when they are too large for their space.

Lightly cut back lavenders to prevent them getting too woody.

If you fancy pot grown fruit trees and bushes now is the time to plant them. You can also sow sweet peas outdoors.

Sowing outdoors is an inexpensive easy way to grow new plants. It's now time to sow outdoors the following:

Carrots



Beetroot Lettuce Leeks Sweet Peppers Radish Tomatoes Marrow Cucumbers Peas Courgettes Spring and pickling Onions



Tie in climbing and rambling roses and protect fruit blossom from late frosts.

If you have bamboo, now is the time to divide it.

Pots and tubs will benefit from topping up with fresh compost.

If plants are showing signs of being pot-bound, you should pot them on.

Continue to protect lilies, delphiniums and Hosta's from slugs and snails.

If you or a family member need extra help because of a longterm illness, disability or mental health condition, money may be available towards paying for it.

The main benefits are:

Disability Living Allowance DLA (for children under 16) Personal Independence Payment PIP (for those aged 16 to State Pension age when applying); and Attendance Allowance AA (for people eligible for a State Pension).

If your child needs a lot more care, attention or supervision than a child of the same age who isn't disabled, or has difficulty walking or getting around outdoors in unfamiliar places, compared to a child of the same age who isn't disabled, you may be eligible for DLA.

You may be eligible for PIP if you struggle to do everyday tasks or to get around because of a physical or mental condition. You don't need to have worked or to have paid National Insurance in order to qualify.

Rates of DLA and PIP vary from £23.70 to £152.15 weekly. You could get £60.00 or £89.60 a week Attendance Allowance. It won't affect your pension and may help you live independently, longer.

You can spend the money however you like. They are not means tested. It doesn't matter what other money you have, or whether you are still working.

You have to complete a long claim form when you apply for PIP or AA. But help is available from your Citizens Advice so don't let the form put you off applying.
