From the Desk of Lloyd Russell-Moyle

MP for Brighton Kemptown and Peacehaven



I was contacted recently by a woman who owns an apartment in Neville Lodge, a group of independent living apartments, with regards to a campaign for safe crossings on Sutton Avenue and the South Coast Road.

People who live in the area have described the current road islands as unsafe. Considering the road has, alongside Neville Lodge, a retirement facility, an elderly persons day centre and two school campuses on either side, it is essential that there is a safe way to cross the road.

Not having this prevents residents from being able to access the Dell Park and the Promenade, which they mention in their petition started in May. This isn't just an issue for elderly people wanting to cross the road but for families with young children as well, attempting to cross to use the children's playground in the park.

Not having safe crossings also prevents people from going outside more. Having a safe way to cross the road would encourage more people to get out: to exercise, see friends, or just to get fresh air.

I am glad Councillor Ciarron Clarkson is working with the community on the petition, as well as other local groups and organisations who want additional safe crossings. The petition runs until the fourteenth of July, and has 45 signatures so far, and I am glad to hear the council will consider any suggestions made regarding crossings.

I fully support their efforts and think the crossing is well needed, and will support the campaign in any way I can.

A day in the life of a Citizens Advice volunteer adviser

Like many, my day now begins at the kitchen table. I log in early to check updates, then join the online daily team meeting with the Advice Session Supervisor, four volunteer advisers, two trainees and a debt worker. The Supervisor allocates incoming cases volunteers. We call on her if we need help.

My first client is the victim of a serious crime, whose physical and mental ill health has forced them to give up work. Their partner is unable to work and their young child has behavioural issues.

I go through possible benefits for each family member, arrange a disability benefit form-filling appointment, explain ways to maximise income and possible debt options. We explore grounds for a disability discrimination claim. The call takes over an hour. I write up the case before moving on.

Detailed write-ups, noting sources from our continually updated web resources, are kept on our secure data base. Case notes enable another adviser to see exactly what advice has already been given, and why. Write-ups are sample checked and some are audited.

My subsequent calls include a Child Benefit claim, an employer abusing the furlough scheme, and a woman being stalked.

It's nearly 5 when I finish. Satisfaction comes from feeling I've done as well as I can for our clients.

Campaign for safer crossings on Sutton Avenue and South Coast Road (A259)

Residents of Neville Lodge have organised a campaign for a safe crossing on Sutton Avenue. Supported by members of U3A, the Peacehaven Telscombe Cliffs and East Saltdean Access Group and representatives for Kempton House they are petitioning East Sussex County Council.

The residents and local groups want more safe crossings on Sutton Avenue and the South Coast Road (A259). This would help people access the high street, the play park and The Dell. Jacqui Webber a U3A representative said, "There are a lot of older people in the area being let down in their later life. Retirement should be a joy but can be an anxious experience. There are lots of mental health and loneliness issues for members living on their own. Accessibility and being able to access public services and green spaces is really helpful for mental health. People can feel like prisoners in their own homes."

Deanne Smith a resident at Home Coast House and U3A rep for diversity and inclusion said, "When the road was widened it sped up traffic and reduced cars waiting. Widening is for cars with no consideration of pedestrians." The Sutton Avenue junction with the South Coast Road (A259) has two independent living apartments for retired people and campuses for Peacehaven Heights on either side as well as an elderly person's day centre. It is also opposite a play area and The Dell. Paper petitions have been delivered to the businesses along this part of the South Coast Road (A259) for business owners and customers to sign.

Ciarron Clarkson is the Lewes District Councillor for Peacehaven West. He said, "The towns of Peacehaven and Telscombe have largely been



designed around the car and thinking about cars first, but this area is not just a piece of road people drive through to access Brighton or Eastbourne. It's a beautiful part of Sussex with residents who want to be able to walk down the street, visit friends and businesses. Creating safe walking routes improves health, improves the local economy, improves mental health, reduces elderly loneliness, reduces cars on the road. If it can do all that and make pedestrians safer, we should be doing it. The widening of the Sutton Avenue roundabout is the perfect example of how Telscombe and Peacehaven are viewed by East Sussex County Council. They widened the roundabout to improve traffic flow and reduce wait times for cars, but no thought was given to pedestrians. Following these changes, the road is less safe for those who walk to access the nearby park and high street."

Gardening Tips for July From The Peacehaven Horticultural Society

Deadhead bedding plants and perennials, to continue flowering. Deadhead Roses to keep them looking tidy, but if they produce Hips (seed pods), you can leave those on.

Deadhead Sweet Peas regularly to keep them flowering, but don't forget to water them daily in dry weather.

Don't forget to give the lawn a quick acting summer feed. In case we have bad weather don't forget to support tall plants and climbers.

Terracotta pots are prone to evaporation so dampen the pot down to keep the roots inside cool and damp. Water a late in the day a possible to reduce evaporation.

Nor is the time to prune Wisteria by removing the wispy side shoots from the main branch framework.

Prune Lupins to encourage more flowers.

Pick Runner Beans to prevent them becoming stringy.

Don't forget to pinch out Tomato side shoots each week, cut off any leaves growing below the lowest ripening fruit trusses.

Now is the time to pick Courgettes, Beetroot, Peas, Carrots, Potatoes, Lettuce and Tomatoes.

If you are growing Cucumbers, you can train them upwards to make the most of the space available.

If you are having a go at growing Peppers, the best thing to do is to pot them into larger pots.

Don't forget to keep the fruit and vegetable crops consistently moist by watering them daily, especially in warm weather.

Don't forget to thin out fruits on the fruit trees to produce good sized crops. Protect any developing fruits from birds and squirrels, you can do this by placing mesh around your plants.

If you are growing fruits in pots, don't forget to give them a high potash liquid feed.

Now is the time to prune the fruit trees like Plum, Apricot, Cherry and Peach.

If you have Raspberries don't forget they will need to be watered generously in hot weather.

Don't forget to control the Dreaded Slugs! Happy Gardening
