From The Desk Of The Town Clerk

Firstly, I must congratulate everyone involved in putting on this year's very successful Summer Fair. There is so much work taking place behind the scenes before and after the event, as well as on the day itself. All monies made will go into supporting the Mayor's charities and subsidising future planned events.

Our new Mayor, Cllr Lucy-Jo Symonds, is very much community-focused and is keen to ensure that as much help and support as possible reaches all those who need it. We are here to help if we can or, if not, help you find someone who can help.

The Council is looking at the future of The Hub building at the Big Park. We want to maximise its use as a community facility and will soon be seeking your views.

A new Town Plan is being produced to focus the Council's activities in the areas that are of importance to residents. We need to make sure that we are using your Council Tax contribution effectively and appropriately. We will shortly be seeking your views on this as well.

The CCTV project is moving along. The existing equipment in the Big Park is being replaced and will be linked into the Sussex Police live system. Once that has been completed, we will look at other potential CCTV sites in that area and later across the whole Town. This is about ensuring residents safety.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan is progressing well and already has some influence in ensuring that any development in the Town is controlled and suitable. Later this year there will be a formal referendum to seek your support for its adoption by Lewes District Council.

The Council has secured funding for employing consultants to look at a part of the South Coast Road with a view to making it a more attractive area to encourage increased use of local businesses and increasing visitor numbers. We will keep you updated as this progresses.

We are looking at sustainable transport for the community and finding solutions for the inadequate public transport system in and around the Town. The Council is keen to have a lot more control over this and the finances available, as clearly the large commercial operators are not doing a good job.

Finally, to let you know that the Council has had initial meetings with representatives for Morrisons over its plans to build a large supermarket on the site of the existing Meridian Centre. This is all in the early stages but look out for a public consultation event in the near future.

The Service was followed by tea, coffee and cake, which gave me the chance to speak to members of the congregation and share some of the things I am hoping to do as Mayor, as well as listening to some of the priorities that our community has.



At the start of July we had our amazing Community Summer Fair, hosted at Centenary Park, which saw over 70 stalls, a car boot sale, animals from the Stud Farm, my parade to open the Fair, and thousands of members of our community attending throughout the day. We couldn't have asked for better weather. I spent a wonderful day going around the Fair, speaking to as many people as I could, and judging competitions throughout the day including the Summer Bonnet competition, choosing the dog the Mayor would most like to take home from the Dog Show (all of them!), and drawing the raffle. My thanks go to everyone that was involved in the event and made such a great day possible.



I have also had some productive meetings with local charities. Part of the honour of being Mayor is that I get to select three charities to support during my term, and with so many local charities doing such awesome work in our community, the decision has been a tough one. 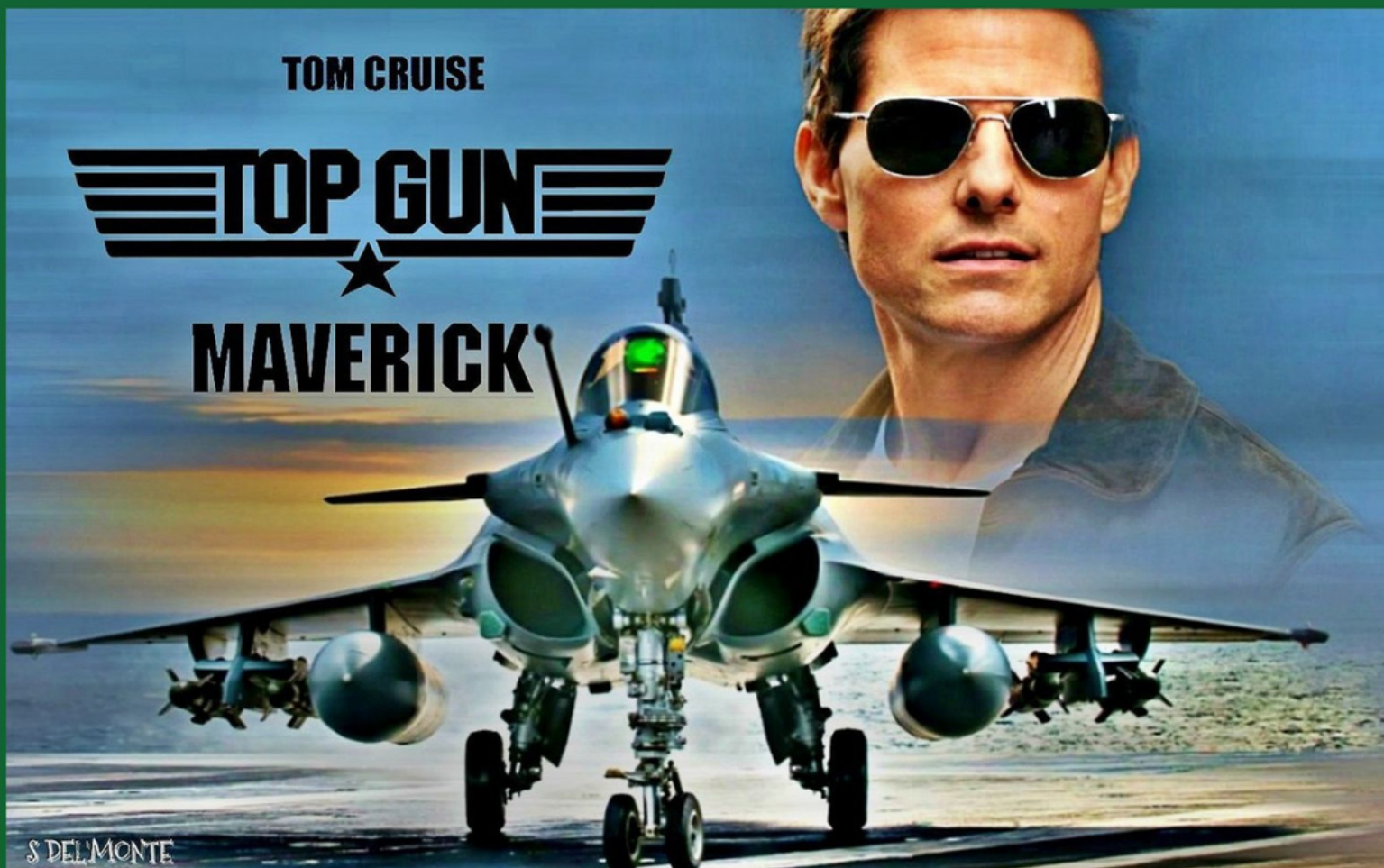

PEACEHAVEN PUPILS BECOME BUILDERS FOR THE DAY AT LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

Gardening Tips for August

Apparently August is usually one of the hottest months of the year, but I think July is this year! This makes watering essential, especially containers and new plants.

Don't forget to top up ponds and bird baths regularly.

If you have a Wisteria it's now time to prune it by removing all the whippy side shoots from the main branch framework to about 20cm from the base, along with summer-flowering shrubs such as lavender once they have finished flowering.

Deadhead flowering plants regularly.

Collect seed from garden plants.

Don't forget to keep on top of the weeds.

You can cut back faded perennials to keep borders tidy.

If you grow herbs you can now cut them back to encourage tasty new leaves you can harvest before the frost.

Take cuttings of Pelargoniums and Fuchsia now to propagate them for next year.

Now is the time to prune climbing roses and Rambling Roses once they have finished flowering, unless they are repeat flowerers in which case don't touch them!

Stake tall or top heavy Dahlias or Lilies to prevent wind damage.

If you have fruit plants in containers make sure you give them a high potash liquid feed to keep them productive and healthy.

Don't forget to keep the birds off the berries with netting or you can use old net curtains!

You can tidy up your Strawberry plants now along with pruning your Blackcurrants and harvesting the fruit trees like Cherries and Plums. Early varieties of Apple Trees should be ready towards the end of the month.

Peacehaven & Telscombe Neighbourhood Plan Supported In Consultation

The latest round of community engagement (March/April 2022) showed that 90% of the consultation responses received, supported the Peacehaven & Telscombe Neighbourhood Plan (PTNP) vision for the towns to be sustainable, with clean air and an environment providing a good quality of life and well-being for all inhabitants and visitors.

Responses also emphasised the need for more social infrastructure and services such as health services, school places and retail provision.

The plan and accompanying reports have collated these responses as part of the evidence base for the draft Neighbourhood Plan policies and these will be presented to both Town Councils in the Autumn. The documents will then be submitted to Lewes District Council for further technical checks and assessments and hopefully this will lead to a local referendum for adoption of the document in 2023.

If adopted the Neighbourhood Plan will be the start of an on-going living document that will help Peacehaven and Telscombe manage area changes and encourage future economic growth. The plan will continue to be reviewed and updated through to its replacement in 2030.

Includes driving that is careless, deliberately aggressive or dangerous. For example:

- Speeding • Thoughtless driving • Under-age driving • Drink or drug driving • Mobile phone use • Unlicensed or uninsured driving
- Driving without a seatbelt • No MOT or unsafe vehicles

YOU NEED TO TELL US:

1. **About the vehicle** the colour, make, model and number plate
2. **Where the incident happened** including house numbers, road names, shops or local landmarks that help narrow it down
3. **What happened** what you saw or experienced

Always make sure to pull over in a safe place to make any notes - or ask a passenger to record the details.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU REPORT ANTI-SOCIAL DRIVING TO CRACKDOWN?

That depends on the incident. The details you provide will be kept on our database; some reports lead to arrest and prosecution. It is **always** worth making a report. Working together, we can crack down on anti-social driving and make Sussex roads safer.

I'm due to fly to Spain during the school summer holidays. After hearing about all the problems at airports, I'm really worried. My family have been looking forward to this and it's cost us a lot of money. What do we do if our flight is cancelled or delayed?

A lot of people will be worried after seeing the recent news about flights. If you face issues, the Citizens Advice website has lots of information about what to do when your flight is delayed or cancelled. If you're already at the airport when they announce the delay, the airline should give you food and drink, access to phone calls and emails. You should also get accommodation if you're delayed overnight (including journeys to and from the airport). Your airline might offer you vouchers to pay for these or advise you to keep receipts to claim back expenses later. They will only refund 'reasonable' expenses, not expensive meals or luxury hotels. What counts as a long enough delay to get this help depends on how long your flight is. A short flight only needs to be delayed two hours, whereas a flight of more than 3,500km needs to be more than four hours.

Food poverty is defined by the Department of Health as: 'The inability to afford, or to have access to, food to make up a healthy diet'.

The impact of food poverty could include being worried about where your next meal will come from, being hungry between meals, skipping meals, having to choose between heating and eating, or not eating a sufficient and healthy diet due to a lack of funds or access.

Who can apply? We are inviting applications from organisations which support people to access food when they may have limited capacity to do so due to personal or economic circumstances. We can help to fund projects that connect the community to better food, understanding that food poverty is not only access to food but to food that is good for our health, minds and the planet. SUSSEX PET RESCUE

IS LOOKING FOR FOSTER HOMES



All our dogs are placed in 'foster homes' whilst they wait to be re-homed. These are people who are prepared to look after a dog in their own home for as long as it takes us to find permanent and loving homes.

This could be a matter of days, weeks or even a few months but it gives us a chance to assess the needs of the particular dog e.g. can he/she live with another dog, older children, cats, etc. It also gives us an opportunity to check the health of the dog and to vaccinate, micro-chip and neuter.

These wonderful 'foster homes' give the dog love, time and exercise freely. However, Sussex Pet Rescue always pays for expenses such as petrol and all food and veterinary bills.

As with adoption, we also carry out home checks for new fosterers and we ask you to sign a form indemnifying Sussex Pet Rescue from any damage that may be caused to the foster home, although in reality, only on a very few occasions has any damage been caused.

We're looking for:

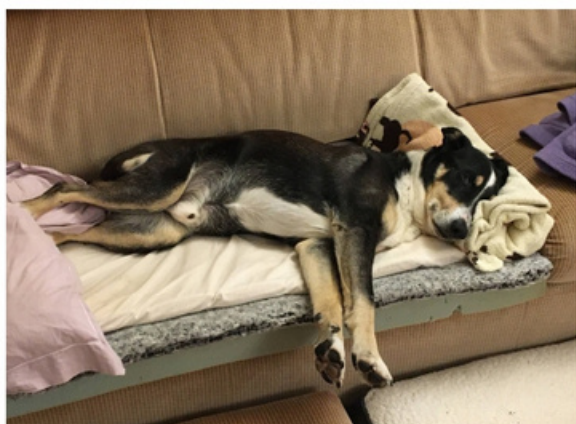
Some experience of taking care of a dog is needed

Someone at home most of the day as dogs may be insecure if they have lost their homes

A secure garden

No very young children who may not understand that insecure dogs need their own space and time to adapt.

Most of all you need a love of dogs and patience with their behaviour when it isn't quite up to scratch. They occasionally need help with house training and learning not to chew etc!
