I have to praise our Mayor, Councillor Lucy-Jo Symonds, our Civic Officer, George Dyson, the rest of the Council Team and all others involved in making it happen.

The result will be a highly professional and detailed document to ensure that future development of the Town is properly controlled and is appropriate.

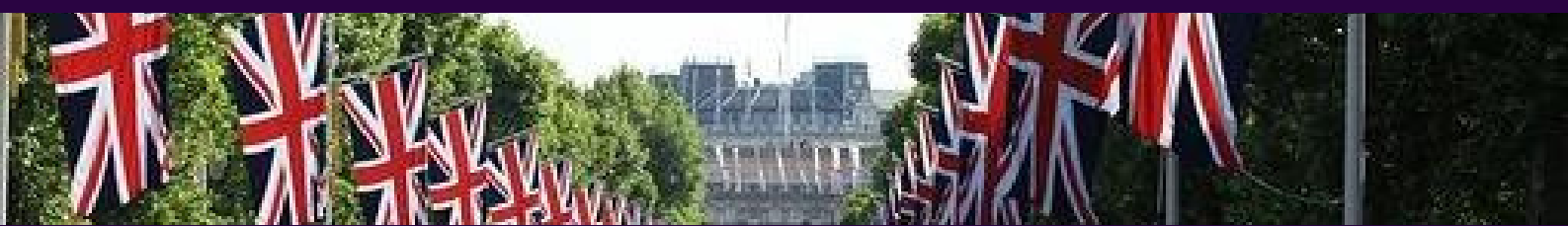


Finally, it was with great sadness that I learned of the death of our past Mayor, Jackie Harrison-Hicks, who passed away on the 19th September.

Unfortunately, September also saw the sad loss of The Queen, Elizabeth II, and I, along with all the other Councilors and Officers of Peacehaven Town Council, mourned her death, and showed our respect by opening a book of condolence at Community House, laying a wreath at the memorial, attending services of thanksgiving, and bringing together the people of Peacehaven to view the funeral at the Gateway Café.

The death of our Queen also marked the Ascension of our King – His Majesty King Charles III. I attended the East Sussex Proclamation of his ascension at County Hall and then, with the support of Deputy Lieutenant Maureen Chowen, proclaimed the ascension at the Peacehaven memorial.



I would like to finish with a brief look at what's to come; we have some great events upcoming soon to look forward to, including Wrestling, The Barn Dance, a Spooktacular Tricky Trail for Halloween, and don't forget the regular Bingo at Community House.

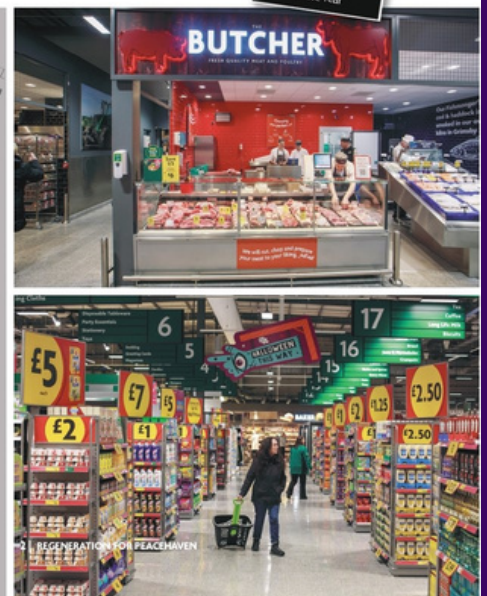
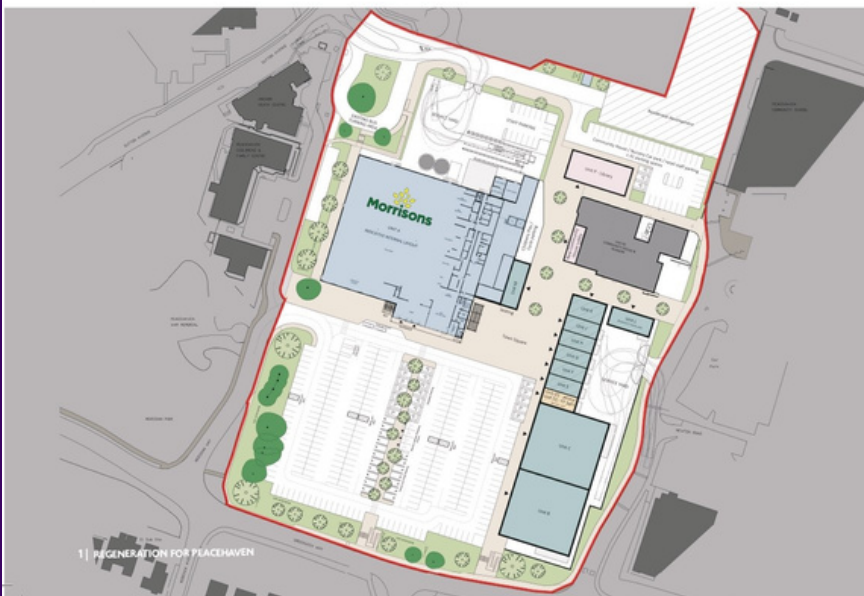

Reporting Online Could Save Lives

Sussex Police would like to remind residents that the decision they make when choosing how to report a crime could be the difference between saving a life - or not.

It is vital phone lines are kept clear for people who need to contact police during a genuine emergency and need assistance urgently.

But it is not just for emergencies where it is important that the phone lines are kept clear. Some of the most vulnerable members of our community, like the elderly who may not have access to the internet, will call us to report non-emergencies.

Please be considerate when choosing how to report a non-emergency with Sussex Police so every resident can access the same levels of good service.

There are many advantages to reporting online which could be more beneficial to you.

Rather than relaying an account of your report to a Contact Officer, you can submit a comprehensive account which can be done at your leisure.

The Force does experience a high volume of calls, particularly to our 101 number, so by reporting online, you do not need to spend time waiting in a queue to contact us.

One of the most common misconceptions about reporting online is that reports aren't seen or triaged by a Contact Officer. You can be reassured that all reports made online are assessed by a skilled Contact Officer - the very same people who you would normally speak to if you called 101.

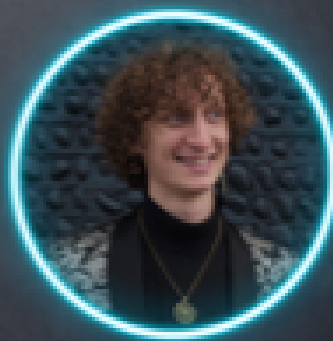

GARRDENING TIPS FOR OCTOBER

The weather has changed and autumn is upon us, haven't the last few months flown by.

October is the time for cleaning up in the garden, water butts may need cleaning out along with gutters. You should also cover wood garden furniture and terracotta pots will need bringing inside as they have a tendency to freeze and crack.

Now is the best time to plant winter pansies, wallflowers and spring flowering bulbs to give you lovely spring colours. You can also plant new perennials, trees and shrubs.

You can replant hanging baskets with spring flowering bulbs, trailing ivy, winter heathers and spring bedding plants.

You can divide overcrowded and poor flowering herbaceous plants and cut back perennials that have died down.

You should also prune climbing roses.

Pumpkins that were planted in April, May and June should now be ready for harvesting in October. If you have any spare, then hollow them out as they make great bird feeders.

Don't forget to move tender plants into a conservatory or greenhouse.

If you have a greenhouse now is the time to insulate it using bubble wrap.

You can care for your lawn by brushing leaves or raking them off the grass. The end of October is the correct time of year for the last cut of the lawn - make sure you cut it slightly higher than during the summer months as this will protect your lawn from winter frost damage.

If you like hyacinths, you should plant them now. They will give a lovely scent and colour in your home, but make sure you get the 'prepared' ones.

News from The Mayor's Chosen Charities



WAVE COMMUNITY BANK HAS LAUNCHED A NEW HELP POINT WITHIN HAVENS COMMUNITY HUB AT 2A THOMPSON ROAD, DENTON, BN9 0RS IN AN EFFORT TO HELP LOCAL RESIDENTS ACCESS FINANCIAL SERVICES AND HELP WITH MANAGING THEIR MONEY.

The drop-in Help Point is open every Wednesday from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The latest price-cap rise in energy costs is predicted to create even more users of the services of the Hub projects and on concern for the management team of the Hub was the thought of people turning to 'loan sharks' or disreputable lenders to cope with higher outgoings.

Wave Community Bank was formerly known as The East Sussex Credit Union. A credit union is a financial co-operative which provides savings, loans and a range of services to its members. It is owned and controlled by the members.

"I think Wave Community Bank approaching us at this time to have a session at the Hub offers so many positive opportunities to prevent people from being forced to take high interest loans or loan shark payments to make ends meet at this very difficult time for us all," said Paula Woolven, Founder of the Hub.



"Community Banking from a Community Hub just makes sense. Wave Community Bank's ethical, sustainable, successful savings and loan schemes match the ethos of the Hub – providing joint solutions for community members," Paula added.

Havens Community Hub helps meet unmet community needs and during the height of the pandemic, launched three new projects.

Havens Community Cars, a volunteer care driver scheme to help people who are unable to use public transport; Havens Food Cooperative, a waste reduction and priority redistribution food pantr, and Havens Happy Clubs, activity and social clubs for older people with complex needs. The Hub also offers support and guidance to other local charities and causes to help them remain sustainable and active.

As the cost of living crisis continues with rising food and energy prices, we look at what you can do to cope with the soaring prices and what to do if you are in financial difficulties

Lewes District Citizens Advice can provide help with income maximisation, budgeting and debt, food bank referrals, fuel and other vouchers.

The government has announced a number of measures to ease the cost of living crisis. These include the £650 Cost of Living Payment for households on means-tested benefits.

The Disability Cost of Living Payment entitles disabled people to a payment of £150.

The £400 Energy Bill Discount is automatic and will be applied in six instalments between October 2022 and March 2023.

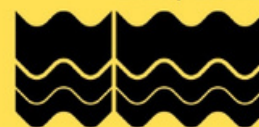
In the winter months, pensioners can get between £100 and £300 to help pay heating bills. This winter, they will also receive an extra one-off £300 Pensioner Cost of Living Payment.

Further support is available to help with transport, utilities, housing and childcare costs.

If your energy problem is urgent, for example your energy supply is about to be cut off, Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline will usually transfer your call directly to the Extra Help Unit.

You can contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on Freephone 0808 223 1133.
