

FROM MP, LLOYD-RUSSELL MOYLE

We have had one of the driest summers on record but, unfortunately, that hasn't stopped Southern Water from dumping raw sewage into our rivers and off our coast. The problem has arisen from the few storms we have had which created considerable run off which meant the network has not be able to cope and they claim they had to dump the sewage.

New analysis has shown that over the last six years, there have been at least 1,261,498 sewage spill events. This means that on average, water companies have dumped sewage on to our beaches and into our waters every two and a half minutes.

Rivers in England are used as open sewers. Not one river is in a healthy condition, with none meeting good chemical standards and only 14% meeting good ecological standards.

Southern Water was recently found guilty of illegally dumping sewage and fined £90 million but, while it is cheaper to pay the fine rather than fix the problem, they will continue to do so. I have been very vocal about this problem in Parliament and have met with the CEO previously.

While water bills continue to rise, the public is entitled to a proper service that doesn't involve the dumping of sewage on to our beaches.





PEACEHAVEN TOWN COUNCIL INSTALLS SEDUM-ROOFED GREEN BUS SHELTER - COUNCIL CONTINUES ITS COMMITMENT TO BE NET ZERO CARBON BY 2030

PEACEHAVEN IS FULL OF NATURAL BEAUTY - FROM THE STUNNING BACKDROP OF THE SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK, THE SWATHING RICH COUNTRYSIDE AND BEAUTIFUL COASTAL BEACHES AND VISTAS; IT IS A TOWN TO BE SUSTAINED NOT ONLY FOR TODAY'S COMMUNITY, BUT FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS TO COME.

TO HELP MAKE THIS A REALITY, PEACEHAVEN TOWN COUNCIL COMMITTED TO WORK TOWARDS THE TOWN BECOMING NET ZERO CARBON BY 2030 AND IS MAKING PROGRESS. NOT ONLY THROUGH WORKING WITH LOCAL BUSINESSES AND RESIDENTS TO HELP CUT EMISSIONS, PROMOTING SUSTAINABLE ENERGY, UNDERTAKING ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY PRACTICES AND INITIATIVES, BUT ALSO BY INSTALLING THE TOWN'S FIRST GREEN BUS SHELTER, COMPLETE WITH A SEDUM (A GENUS OF THE CRASSULACEAE FAMILY OF SUCCULENT PLANTS) ROOF.

THE 'GREEN' BUS SHELTER HAS JUST BEEN INSTALLED ON SUTTON AVENUE THANKS TO THE PERSEVERANCE AND HARD WORK OF VICKY ONIS, THE COUNCIL'S COMMITTEES AND ASSISTANT PROJECTS OFFICER.

DESPITE VALIANT EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN THE OLD BUS SHELTER, TIME AND WEATHER TOOK ITS TOLL AND THE STRUCTURE HAD BECOME SEVERELY RUSTY AND DEEMED BEYOND REPAIR AT ITS LAST INSPECTION. VICKY TOOK ON THE PROJECT AND, THROUGH SECURING FUNDING FROM THE COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (CIL), WAS ABLE TO ARRANGE FOR THE NEW, LARGER 'GREEN' SHELTER TO BE PROCURED AND INSTALLED.

"THE NEW SHELTER HAS TWO ENTRANCES, A SEDUM ROOF AND IS 50% LARGER THAN ITS PREDECESSOR. THIS MAKES IT EASIER FOR MOBILITY SCOOTERS AND PRAMS TO ACCESS AND IS COVID SAFE, SO PEOPLE WHO ARE WAITING FOR A BUS CAN KEEP THEIR DISTANCE FROM ONE ANOTHER MORE EASILY." SAID VICKY.

COMMENTING ON THE 'GREEN' BUS SHELTER, COUNCILOR DAVID SEABROOK, THE DEPUTY MAYOR OF PEACEHAVEN SAID: "SEDUM IS A GOOD CHOICE FOR A GREEN ROOF, AS IT IS A PLANT THAT STORES WATER IN ITS LEAVES, TOLERATES DROUGHT AND IS VERY HARDY. AS WELL AS PROVIDING GOOD ROOF COVER, IT IS ALSO EASY TO MAINTAIN."

DUE TO ITS LARGER SIZE, THE 'GREEN' BUS SHELTER HAD TO BE SLIGHTLY RELOCATED AND THEREFORE THE PLANS HAD TO GO THROUGH THE PLANNING PERMISSION PROCEDURE. VICKY ADDED: "IT'S GREAT TO REACH THE POSITIVE OUTCOME WE HAVE TODAY. RECEIVING PLANNING PERMISSION, APPROVAL FROM THE BUS COMPANY AND LAND OWNERS WAS WONDERFUL AND NOW THE TOWN HAS ITS FIRST 'GREEN' BUS SHELTER, WHICH WITH ITS CONTEMPORARY STYLE. FITS NICELY ALONG SUTTON AVENUE."







GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER

Haven't the last few months flown by!

It's best to start dividing the herbaceous perennials now September is upon us.

You can collect and sow seed from the perennials and hard annuals.

If you are lucky to have Dahlias they may be at the best now. You should still deadhead flowers to continue flowering.

Once you have had a good weeding in the garden, you can put mulch around the plants with compost to protect them by keeping them warm.

If you have Autumn Raspberries you should pick them now.

Don't forget to dig up remaining potatoes before the slugs beat you to it and ruin them!

Now September is here, you can clean out your greenhouse and cold frames so they will be ready in the autumn for you to use.

It's now time to plant spring flowering bulbs ready for colour next year.

It may be September, but don't forget to keep up with watering.

If you love to feed the birds, don't forget they will love the seedheads.

Living Well in East Sussex survey

Together with its residents and partners, East Sussex County Council is developing a long-term plan, its strategy, for adult social care.

To understand what really matters to local people, and so that the strategy can be informed and led by what is important to people who need care and support, their unpaid carers and their families, the adult social care team has created the 'Living Well in East Sussex' survey.

This survey is the starting point for creating a strategy that will set the future direction of adult social care for everyone who has - or will have - care and support needs within the county, the projects and services that support them and their carers and families.

It opens on 08 August 2022 and will close on 18 September 2022

Mark Stainton, East Sussex director of adult social care, said: "Long-term funding, a workforce crisis and living with COVID-19 are just three of the challenges facing adult social care.

"But there are also opportunities, such as exploring new ways of developing and delivering services, the greater public focus on the role and value of social care that the pandemic has brought, and the government's social care reforms.

"Our strategy will describe the priorities for adult social care in East Sussex, provide direction for services, and offer a clear understanding of what our clients, their carers and families, can expect from adult social care."

So, whether you have lots of experience of adult social care - or none at all - East Sussex would like to hear from you.

Talking with East Sussex staff, independent sector care providers, NHS colleagues and wider stakeholders will follow in the autumn/winter, informed by what local people have told us about their priorities.

Small Grants Programme for community projects tackling food poverty



Grants are available for up to £2000 Application Deadline: Friday 9th September, 2022

Lewes District Food Partnership are launching a second round of their successful small grants programme, to award up to £2,000 to projects within Lewes District that tackle food poverty.

Food poverty is defined by the Department of Health as: 'The inability to afford, or to have access to, food to make up a healthy diet'.

The impact of food poverty could include being worried about where your next meal will come from, being hungry between meals, skipping meals, having to choose between heating and eating, or not eating a sufficient and healthy diet due to a lack of funds or access.

Who can apply? We are inviting applications from organisations which support people to access food when they may have limited capacity to do so due to personal or economic circumstances. We can help to fund projects that connect the community to better food, understanding that food poverty is not only access to food but to food that is good for our health, minds and the planet. THE COST OF LIVING IS SO HIGH NOW. WHAT CAN I DO?

Prepayment meter customers can request temporary credit from their energy suppliers - they might add this to your meter automatically, but if they don't, you can ask them to do this.

If you run out of temporary credit, speak to your supplier to explain your situation. They may give you extra temporary credit. There may be extra support available if you're disabled, have a long-term health condition or have children under the age of 5. You'll have to pay back anything extra you get, but you can agree an affordable plan with your supplier.

There's more government support coming from October, including a £400 payment to help you with your energy bills. If you have a prepayment meter, you'll be given vouchers in the first week of each month from October, via SMS text, email or post. Mak sure your energy company has your up-to-date details.

Check you're getting all the benefits you're entitled to - you can use online benefit calculators. On the Citizens Advice website, there's advice on how to reduce living costs and other ways to increase your income.

If you can't afford to buy food, Citizens Advice can help you get a referral for a food bank.


