The Town Council is already looking at its budget and precept requirements for the next Financial Year 2023/2024.

Producing a balanced budget is a complicated affair. We need to consider maintaining and improving services to our residents, whilst at the same time being very conscious about the Town Council's element from your Council Tax.

This year is particularly challenging for all of us, with inflation at over 10%, mortgage payments increasing, energy and fuel prices increasing and food prices rising as well. We have to present our Budget and Precept Statement to Lewes District Council by the end of January next year.

The Town Council must be fully transparent and accountable for its management of public monies and assets. We have at least three independent audits every year to ensure this and I am pleased to say that we have always been able to demonstrate sound financial practices.

FROM MP, LLOYD RUSSELL-MOYLE

Last Wednesday, 19th October, the Liz Truss Government opposed a motion that would have seen Fracking banned in the UK.

Unfortunately, it was defeated, meaning that Fracking is still government policy.

I oppose Fracking for the simple reason that it is not a viable energy source and it is also appalling for the environment. Fracking is the process of pumping chemicals into shale reserves in the ground in order to create a chemical reaction that would give us Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) as that could be used as an energy source.

The process requires up to 1,084 different chemicals being pumped into the ground, which often ends up in water reserves having devastating consequences. It is not just chemical pollution, at the only UK Fracking site currently in the UK there have been 192 recorded earthquakes in a 182 day period.

We are surrounded natural beauty like the South Downs National Park and Seven Sisters. We should be preserving our national environment not putting it in even more peril to get most fossil fuels out of the ground.

I opposed Fracking under the May, Johnson and Truss Governments and, if the Sunak Government decides to agree to Fracking in the future, I will oppose again.



Armistice Day, Friday 11th November 2022

"At the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month - we will remember them."

The signing of the Armistice, the agreement to end the fighting of the First World War as a prelude to peace negotiations, began at 11 a.m. on 11th November 1918.

To honour those who gave so much, Reverend Tim Mills, The Royal British Legion and Peacehaven Town Council will be leading an Armistice Day Memorial Service on Friday 11th November at 10:30 a.m. at The Peacehaven & Telscombe War Memoria (Meridian Park, Meridian Way, Peacehaven, BN10 8NF).

Reverend Mills will conduct the Service and a two minute silence will take place at 11 a.m.

On Sunday 13th November, Peacehaven Town Council will be holding a Remembrance Day Parade and Memorial Service.

Save Safely

With winter rain and chills sweeping in and people starting to think about different ways to save money, East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service has launched a new safety drive – Save Safely.

The Service has gathered together a few ideas which you might want to consider. Not only could these save you a few pennies, they will help reduce the chances of a fire which in itself can be expensive, disruptive and distressing.

Switch off at night! – If you're asleep you are much less likely to spot a small problem (for example smoke coming from a socket) before it becomes a fire. Before you go to bed, or go out, check the living room, the kitchen, home office, your bedroom and so on and switch off! You can save energy this way too.

Close doors – It's amazing how much heat can disappear out the door, and by keeping doors shut, you also reduce the chance of fires spreading from room to room.

WIN £2500 to help launch a new business

LEAP is a FREE Business Start-up Programme that is available to Lewes District based residents who are thinking of starting a new business. The Programme is also open to businesses who have been trading less than 6 months. LEAP is delivered by Edeal Enterprise Agency and is fully funded by Lewes District Council; this intensive business support programme offers a £2500 prize in the form of a grant to one lucky winner!

The LEAP Programme is split into the 3 stages:

STAGE 1: Attendance at a business start-up workshop, this can be either a physical one-day workshop in Lewes on 16th Jan 2023 or a virtual workshop across 2 half days on the 6th and 7th Feb 2023.

After the workshops have been held, 15 candidates are shortlisted to move to stage 2. The remaining candidates are offered additional business advice and support under another mentoring programme.

STAGE 2: The 15 selected candidates will be allocated a dedicated business mentor who will work with them to produce a strong, robust business plan. During this period, they will also attend four 3 hour workshops on Finance, Marketing, Legal and Social Media Marketing.

The completed business plans are submitted and judged when 5 finalists will be selected. The finalists will then present their plan to the judges at a mini-Dragons Den type event where a winner will be chosen. The winner will be announced at an awards event where they will win a cash prize of £2500 and the award – “LEAP Entrepreneur of the Year”.

STAGE 3: Additional mentoring support is offered to help candidates launch their new business.

If They Poop - Please Scoop

We'd like to gently remind all dog owners and walkers to please be extra vigilant and pick-up after your pets and use the bins provided.

This is not just because of the mess it causes, but also the potential health risks to children.

Whether you own a dog or not, dog poo affects everyone. You may be aware that, sadly, there has been an increase in instances of dog fouling recently in our parks, most notably Centenary Park (The Big Park) and on footpaths, verges and perhaps more worryingly on the playground and football pitches where children play.

We thank you for your co-operation and attentiveness.



As the cost of things keeps going up. I'm worried about how I'll cope as it starts getting colder.

You're not alone in struggling with rising costs, but it's important to know there is support available.

If you're finding it hard to stay on top of bills, make sure you are getting all the benefits and financial support with energy and living costs that you are entitled to.

- Lewes District Council Cost of Living Emergency Scheme will provide support to households on a low income but those not in receipt of means tested benefits.
- Discretionary Council Tax Rebate Scheme (Energy) may provide a £150 payment for those households in Council Tax Bands E to H on a means tested benefit or with a net weekly income of under £257. This fund has a deadline of 30th November 2022.
- Help with energy bills. From 1st October 2022, there's a limit on gas and electricity unit prices for most households - The Energy Price Guarantee, which will be in place for two years.
- From October, you'll get £400 off your electricity bill through The Energy Bills Support Scheme. The money will be paid in six installments and you will not be asked to provide any personal or bank account details to receive the payments. If you have a prepayment meter, your supplier will let you know how they will issue the discount.

Gardening Tips For November

Haven't the last few months flown by, I cannot believe it's nearly November!

It is now time to clear up all the fallen leaves, especially from lawns, flower beds and ponds.

If you have garden pots, it's a good idea to raise them off the ground to keep the bottom of the pot out of water and to prevent compost freezing.

You can now plant spring flowering bulbs like tulips and crocus. You can also plant roses now, but try and avoid a space where roses have previously grown.

Don't forget to tie shrubs and climbers on to supports to protect them from wind damage.

Cut down perennials, clear old sweet peas and other annual climbers.

Prune apple and pear trees anytime between now and February.

Even though winter is on its way, please remember to feed and leave water out for wildlife. You can leave seedheads of herbaceous plants for the birds.
