DRAFT Minutes of the meeting of the Planning & Highways Committee held in the Anzac Room, Community House on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> November 2022 at 7.30pm

**Present:** Cllr Alan Milliner, Cllr Isobel Sharkey (Vice Chair), Cllr David Seabrook (Vice Chair of Council), Cllr Cathy Gallagher, Cllr Ron White, Cllr Emelia Simmons.

Officers: George Dyson (Deputy Town Clerk & Civic Officer), Vicky Onis (Committees and Assistant Projects Officer).

3 members of the public were in attendance.

### 1. PH1495 CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Chair opened the meeting at 19:30, welcomed everyone, and went through the building fire procedures.

### 2. PH1496 PUBLIC QUESTIONS

Seng Teng, a resident from Wellington Road, asked the following in relation to planning application LW/22/0694.

Regarding the proposed First Floor Plan,

- 3.1 The proposed terrace sits on a small portion of the approved extension flat roof, but the actual drawing does not show it nor any dimension stated
- 5.1 The proposed roof terrace measures 8.0m, is it the length and width?
- 6.1 The roof terrace will have obscure glazed privacy screens to the north and south flanks, 1.5m high does not give me any privacy

I am approximately 1.4m apart from no 6, Wellington Rd. So anyone on the terrace can look into my glass conservatory, straight into the annexe and the garden.

I strongly object to the application and would be grateful if you will consider my concern.

Mike Gatti then also informed the Committee, in case they were unaware, that the Co-op at the Meridian Centre is due to close on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

There was a discussion about the application, including that a previous application had specified that the flat roof was not to be used as a balcony or terrace.

It was proposed that the Committee object to the application on grounds of overlooking and loss of privacy, the visual effect on a neighbouring property, as well as the fact that a previous application had prohibited some of the proposed use.

### PH1500 TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE FROM CLLR GALLAGHER ON THE EMERGING NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOP-7. **MENT PLAN**

Cllr Gallagher gave a brief update on the emerging Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group and shared the minutes of their most recent meeting and explained the proposed timetable for the plan going forward as well as a brief outline of some of the work still ongoing.

This report was noted.

## 8. PH1501 TO NOTE THE BUDGETARY UPDATE

Cllr Gallagher highlighted that some of the budgetary items have not had any expenditure this year - notably noticeboards, street furniture, and war memorial, and should this be earmarked for use next year.

Cllr Seabrook informed the Committee that the war memorial budget is earmarked each year for expenditure on a 3yearly cycle already.

It was proposed that the unspent monies from noticeboards and street furniture also go into the earmarked reserve.

- The SDNPA CIL funding item can be updated to show that a steering group will be set up.
- The Sustainable Transport (Buses) TFG has now met it's remit and can be removed from the Action Plan there may be a need to have a Chalker's Rise TFG to replace this, which will be discussed at the next meeting of this Committee.

Purpose of Report: To note and understand the finance position.

# Summary of recommended actions

To understand the aims of the councils end of year financial position and make decisions with regards to earmarking funds carefully and with a purpose.

# Introduction

At the financial year end on 31 March 2023, any remaining balance on the Current Year Fund will go into the council's general reserve (unless the council resolves to place some or all of it to an earmarked reserve). If the year-end figure is negative, the balance will be taken out of the council's general reserve.

It is recommended by our external auditors as per their report from the interim audit;

"The Joint Panel on Accountability and Governance (JPAG) Practitioner's guide states 'the generally accepted recommendation with regard to the appropriate minimum level of a smaller authority's general reserve is that this should be maintained at between three and twelve months of net revenue expenditure' (para 5.33)."

The general reserve balance is within the recommended range, but at the lower end and I recommend the council keeps this level under review.

Therefore as a council we need to try and build up the general reserve.

Earmarked reserves should be reserved when the budget set for a particular item has not been bought that financial year due to reasons outside of our control.

Please also note our financial regulations state;

1.1. Changes in earmarked reserves shall be approved by council as part of the budgetary control process.

# <u>Analysis</u>

If a committee wishes to earmark monies for the next financial year then the money earmarked should be for a purpose and that purpose agreed at committee.

Please ask yourselves these questions.

For example – To earmark noticeboards from current year budget.

- Do we already have earmarked reserves for this?
- What is it we want to purchase with earmarked monies?
- Have we received pricing for the item?
- Is the item needed?
- Could we purchase what is required before the end of this financial year?

We need to ensure that we are spending public money correctly but more importantly not unnecessarily.

# <u>Implications</u>

The Town Council has a duty to consider the following implications:

Financial	Whilst a budget is set realistically to spend as it was agreed, we also need to build up our general reserve and therefore we need to make conscious decisions over the next few weeks to ensure we can put money into the general reserves as well as purchase what is required sensibly.

Re: Application for an order to stop up highway adjoining 211 South Coast Road Peacehaven

East Sussex County Council, Legal Services, act for East Sussex County Council in a proposed application to the Magistrates Court for an order to stop up part of the highway adjoining 211 South Coast Road, Peacehaven.

You may have been contacted by Brighton & Hove City Council (then acting for East Sussex County Council) in 2019 concerning the same matter. Unfortunately, the application was not progressed at that time due to the pandemic.

It is proposed to now make the application under Section 117 Highways Act 1980 (the Act) as the owners of 211 South Coast Road have requested East Sussex County Council in its capacity as highway authority to make the application.

Under Section 116(3)(b) of the Act if the highway is in England, the council of the parish in which the highway is situated. The application cannot be made if within two months from the date of service of the notice the town council refuse consent to the making of the application.

Accordingly, please accept this letter as the notice required to Peacehaven Town Council under Section 116(3)(b) of the Act. A plan showing the area of highway in question coloured dark blue is enclosed.

It would be very helpful if you could advise whether or not Peacehaven Town Council consent to the proposed application.

Dear Vicky,

With reference to your query sent on 16 December, I have now received my client's comments. Please see my instructing officer's response below.

To clarify the ramp will still be available for use after a stopping up order, a large proportion of the ramp is already under the control of the land owner.

The purpose of a stopping up order is to remove public highway rights from an area. This would take away the public's right of access and transfers responsibility to the land owner. In this case the area in question hasn't been fully accessible to the public for around 15 years due to the presence of part of the building and a stopping up order would regularise the situation.


When the site at 211 South Coast Road was redeveloped, around 2005, a set of steps, part of the building and a ramp were built on the public highway without the consent of the Highway Authority. Normally the stopping up of the area would have been included as part of the planning application and dealt with via planning legislation at the time, but for some reason it wasn't in this case.


The attached plans shown the current and proposed extents of public highway. The area shaded blue shows the extent of the proposed stopping up. As the entire width of Dorothy Avenue is highway there would still be public access along the road which would be no different to how it has been for the last 15 years.


